I. GENERAL EDUCATION 42 credits minimum

A English Language Competence: ENG 101 is required of all students.

ENG. 101:

B. Arts & Humanities: A minimum of five courses totaling at least 15 credits as follows:

One course in Literature
One course in literature, which may be any 200 or 300-level English course except 202, 203, 204, 208, 301, 302, 303, 304, 308, 312. FR 303 and Spanish 303 may also be used to fulfill this requirement.

HIST ART, FILM, MU or TAD
(For teacher certification, a U.S. history course is required.)

Two courses from Arts & Humanities disciplines: AMST, ART, COMM, ENG, FILM, FR, GER, HIST, JRN, ML, MU, PHIL, SP, TAD or an approved interdisciplinary course (WS 201* or an IDAH course). (For teacher certification, ENG 202 and one additional course in writing beyond ENG 101 and 202 are required.)

C. Social Sciences: A minimum of four courses totaling at least 12 credits in three or more of the Social Science ECON, GEOG, POSC, PSYC, SOC or an approved interdisciplinary course (WS 201* or an IDSS course). (For teacher certification, a geography course is required.)

D. Sciences/Math: A minimum of four courses totaling at least 12 credits as follows: One course in BIOLOGY. One course in a PHYSICAL SCIENCE (ASTR, CHEM, GEOL, MET, PHYS). Two courses from Sciences/Math disciplines: ASTR, BIO, CHEM, CS, ENST, GEOL, MATH, MET, PHYS or an approved interdisciplinary course (IDSM).

BIO PHYSICAL SCIENCE

* WS 201 may be used only once, to fulfill either an Arts & Humanities or Social Science General Education requirement.

II. **MAJOR REQUIREMENTS** 36 ENGLISH CREDITS

Students majoring in this field must complete a minimum of 12 courses (36 credits) in English, in addition to ENG. 101 Essay Writing and a general education literature course which do not count toward the major. All English majors must take ENG 209 Literary Analysis, the introduction to the major, before completing 75 credits toward graduation and before completing 15 credits in English; this course is not open to seniors. Six of the twelve required courses must be at the 300-level and three of the twelve courses must be at the 400-level for a total of nine courses at the 300-and 400-level. Students must complete one 200 level literature course before taking a 300 level course and one 300-level course before taking a 400-level course One course must cover pre-1660 British literature and another must cover pre-1800 literature in any area.

Majors must demonstrate proficiency in a modern language other than English. This may be done through either satisfactory completion of a standardized exam (e.g. department exam, CLEP, AP) or by satisfactory completion of one semester of a modern language at the intermediate level or higher. Courses taken to complete this requirement may be used to fulfill Arts & Humanities General Education requirements.

- B. Two courses in British Literature. (One from pre-1660). Eng 220, 321, 322, 323, 324, 325, 326, 327, 328, 329, 330. and when appropriate 280, 285, 290, 381, 390, 410, 420, 490, 495, 498.

- C. Two courses in American Literature: Eng 210, 240, 245, 341, 342, 343, 344, 345, 346, 347 and when appropriate 280, 285, 290, 381, 390, 410, 420, 490, 495, 498.

- D. Two courses in Multicultural, World, or Continental Literature: Eng 245, 250, 252, 260, 261, 271, 345, 347, 350, 360, 370, 382, 383, and when appropriate 280, 285, 290, 381, 390, 410, 420, 490 495, 498.

- E. One course in Literary Theory: Eng 402, 410 and when appropriate 420, 490, 495, 498.

- F. English Electives: Four courses (12 credits)
