## Recognize the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Kristallnacht, the Night of Broken Glass

September 10, 2008

Dear Colleague:

On November 9<sup>th</sup>, 1938, the Nazi government in Germany coordinated horrific attacks on the Jewish community destroying hundreds of synagogues and Jewish homes and businesses across Germany and Austria. This destructive evening and the calculated acts of violence perpetrated by the Nazis is called Kristallnacht, also known as the “Night of the Broken Glass” because the streets were littered with the shattered windowpanes of Jewish storefronts. In recognition of Kristallnacht and the horrors of this pogrom, we plan on introducing a resolution marking the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this sad day which foreshadowed the horrors of the Holocaust to come.

Kristallnacht was a watershed event in Nazi rule and served as a prelude to the Second World War and the beginning of the Holocaust where millions of innocent Jews and other individuals were killed. Kristallnacht stands as a reminder that anti-Semitism and intolerance are evils that must be confronted forcefully and the civilized world cannot watch idly while barbarism and mass murder is committed against innocent people.

As we recognize the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Kristallnacht please join us in remembering those innocent lives that were lost during the “Night of Broken Glass” as well as the unconscionable horrors that took place during one of the darkest periods in history.
