The following criteria must be met prior to the award of transfer credit from Granite State College.

- Earned a bachelor's degree before starting a post-baccalaureate certification program at GSC.
- Post-baccalaureate courses completed more than five years before the date of matriculation at KSC may not be considered for transfer into a graduate program.
- Possess current certification from an approved state department of education as a result of completion of an approved Post-Baccalaureate program at GSC in General Special Education, Early Childhood Special Education, Emotional and Behavioral Disabilities, Specific Learning Disabilities, Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, or Reading/Writing Specialist. The NH DOE 'Intern License' does not qualify.
- *Reading Specialist (RS) candidates who apply to KSC must present an Alternative IV NH DOE Reading/Writing Specialist certification during the KSC admissions process.

*NOTE – RS candidates may only select the M.Ed.: Curriculum & Instruction degree. After the KSC master's degree is earned, GSC shall work with Reading/Writing Specialist candidates to recommend them for Alternative I certification as a Reading/Writing Specialist per the MOU between the NH Department of Education, Division of Program Support, Bureau of Credentialing and GSC.
- Earned a minimum of 18 post-baccalaureate credits at GSC. The maximum transfer credit award will be 24 transfer credits toward the M.Ed.: Curriculum & Instruction option and 26 toward the M.Ed. Special Education option. Candidates who receive less than the maximum award must complete pre-approved electives.
- Completed at least one year of full-time teaching experience working with children and youth in an appropriate educational setting (pre-K to 12).
- Employed, on at least a half-time basis, in an approved educational setting for the duration of the program.

Transfer Credits and Documentation

Credits used to complete a bachelor's degree are not transferable toward an M.Ed. Only post-baccalaureate credits will be considered for transfer from GSC. A candidate's eligibility to receive transfer credit will be determined after all documentation has been gathered and evaluated.

- Individual course grades must be a B or above (3.0 on a scale of 4.0) to qualify as transfer credit.
- Candidates who receive less than the maximum award must complete pre-approved electives.
- GSC "modules" or non-credit bearing courses do not qualify for transfer.
- Transfer grades do not count toward the 3.0 grade point average required for completion of the M.Ed.

The award of transfer credit via this MOU is limited to individuals who are matriculated at KSC. Qualified transfer credits will be posted to the KSC transcript, free of charge, once all requirements for the M.Ed. have been met. EDUC 612 – Demonstrated Certification Competence is the course used by KSC to transfer approved blocks of credit from GSC.
