The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching has designated Keene State College as a Carnegie Engaged Campus, acknowledging the College's commitment to civic engagement. Values

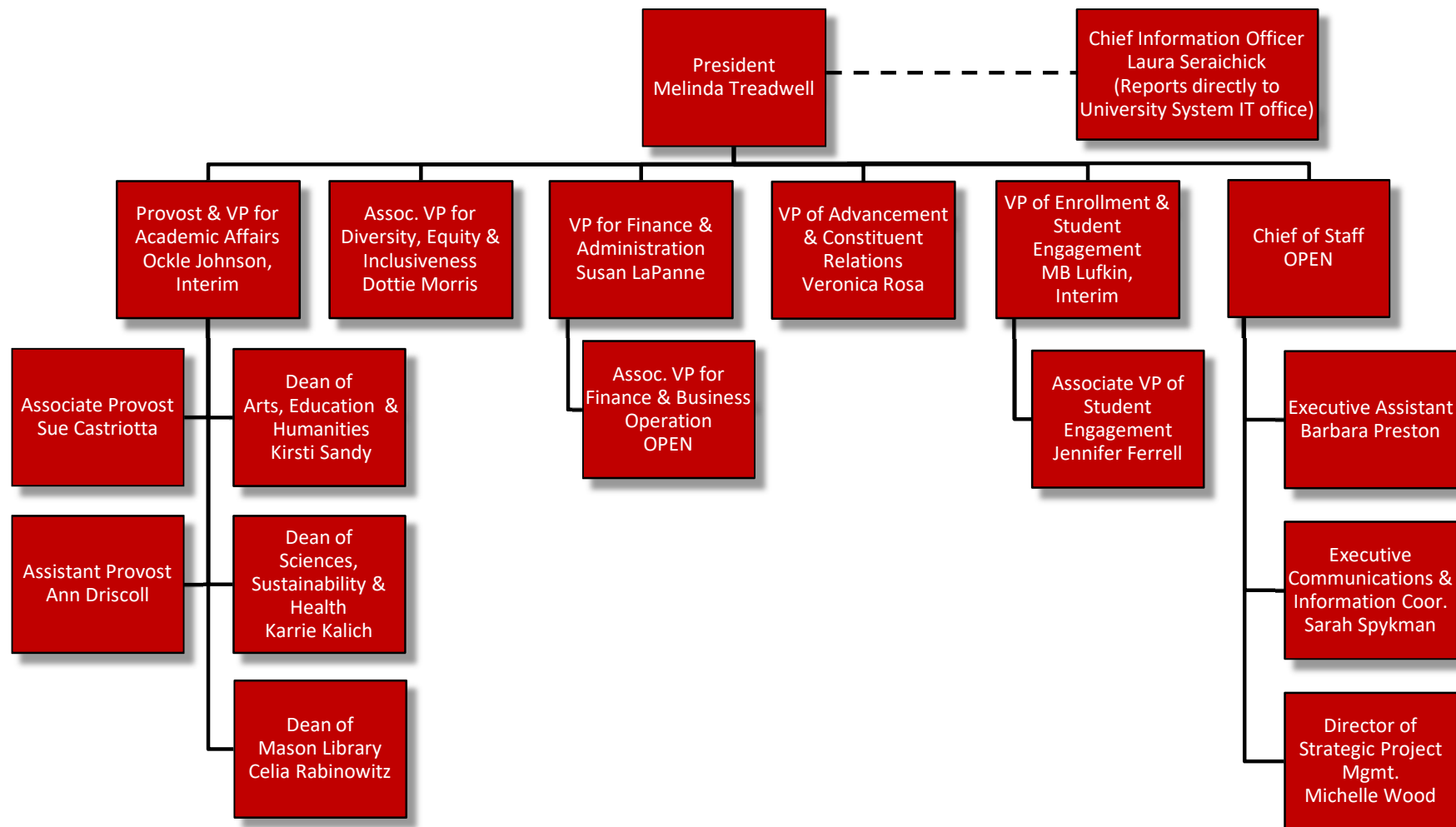

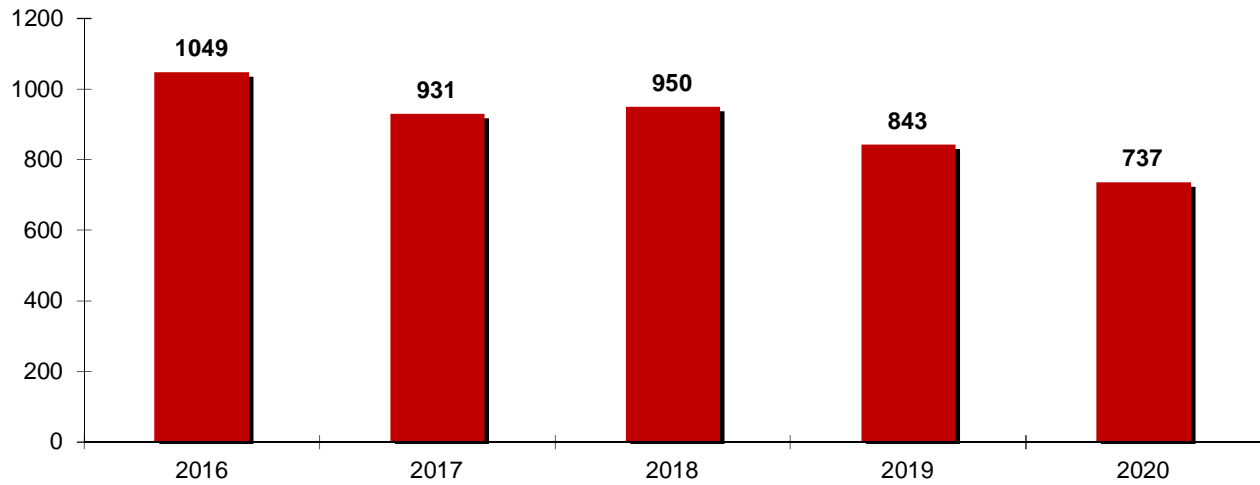

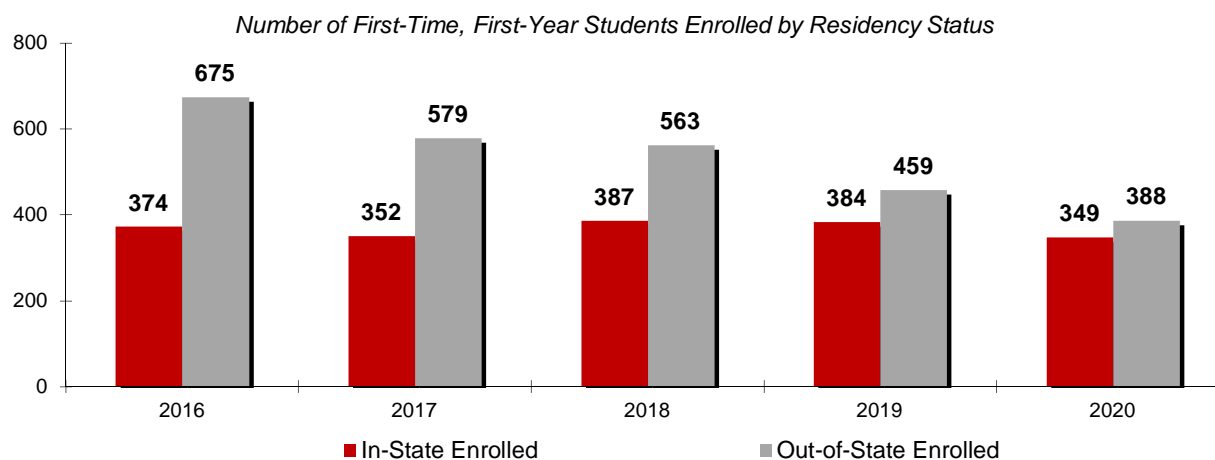

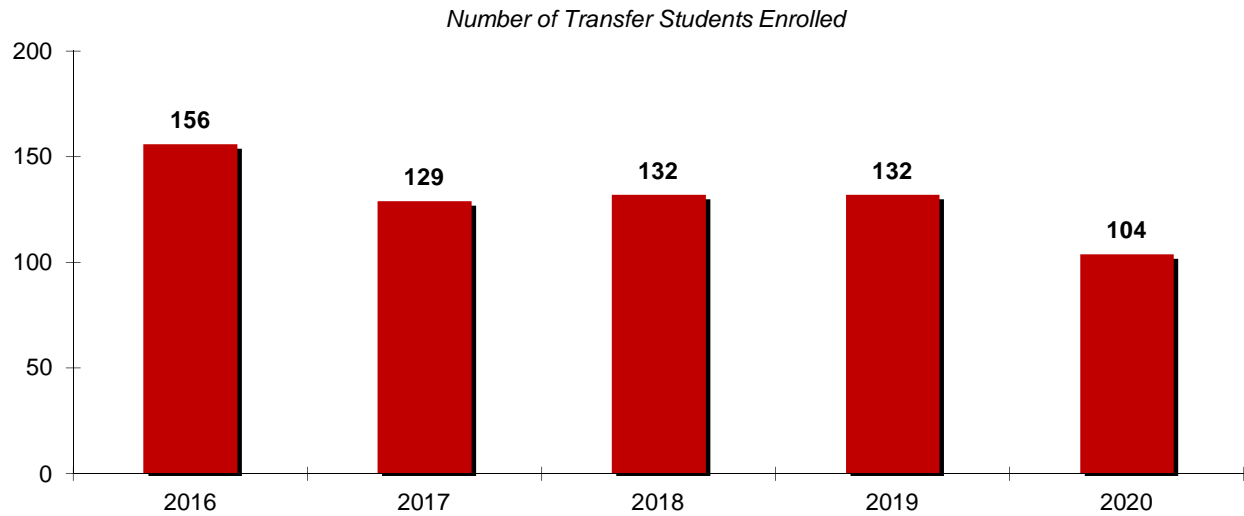

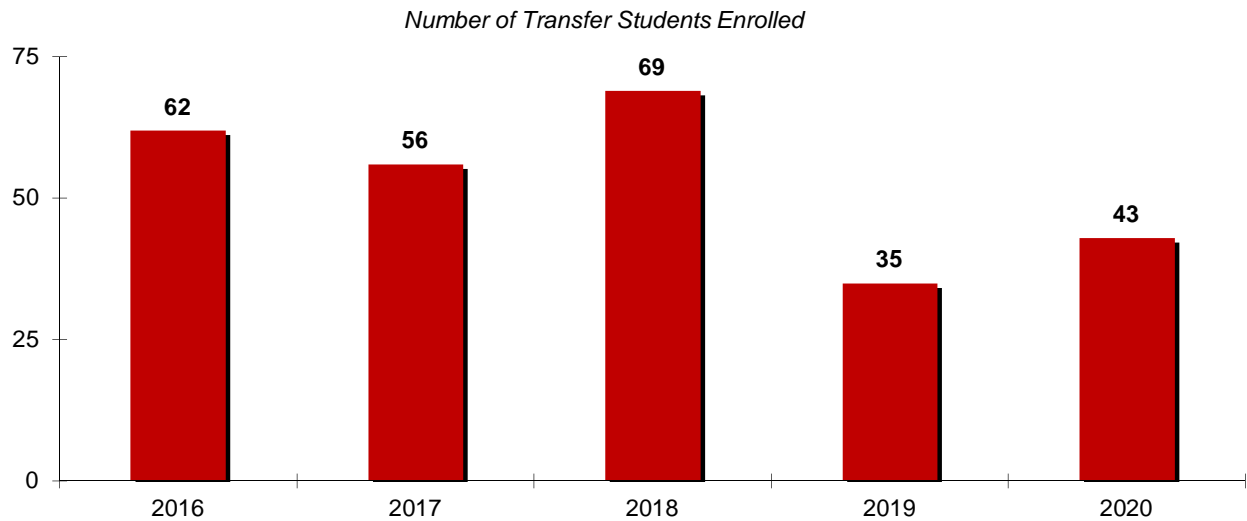

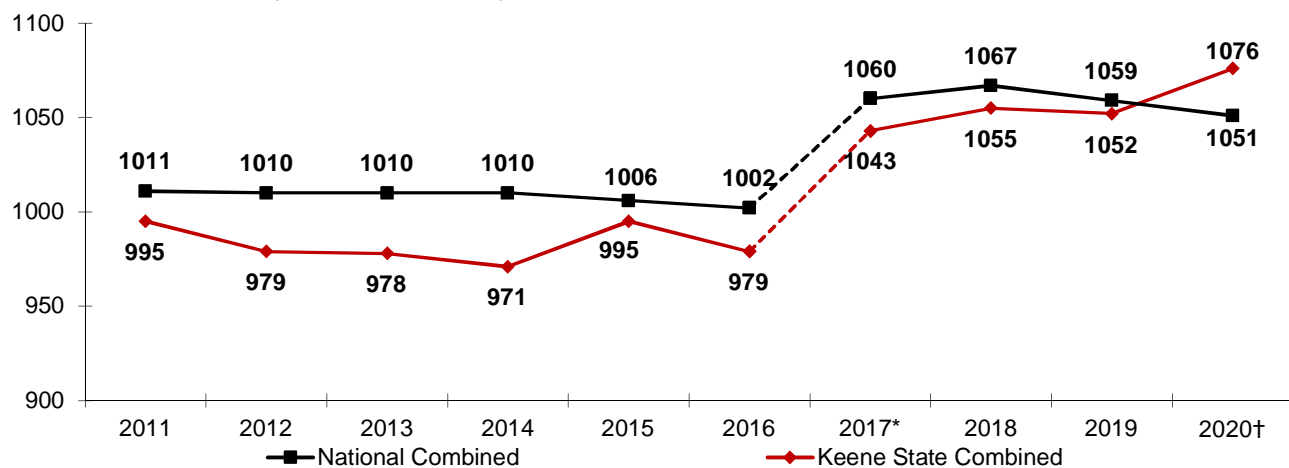

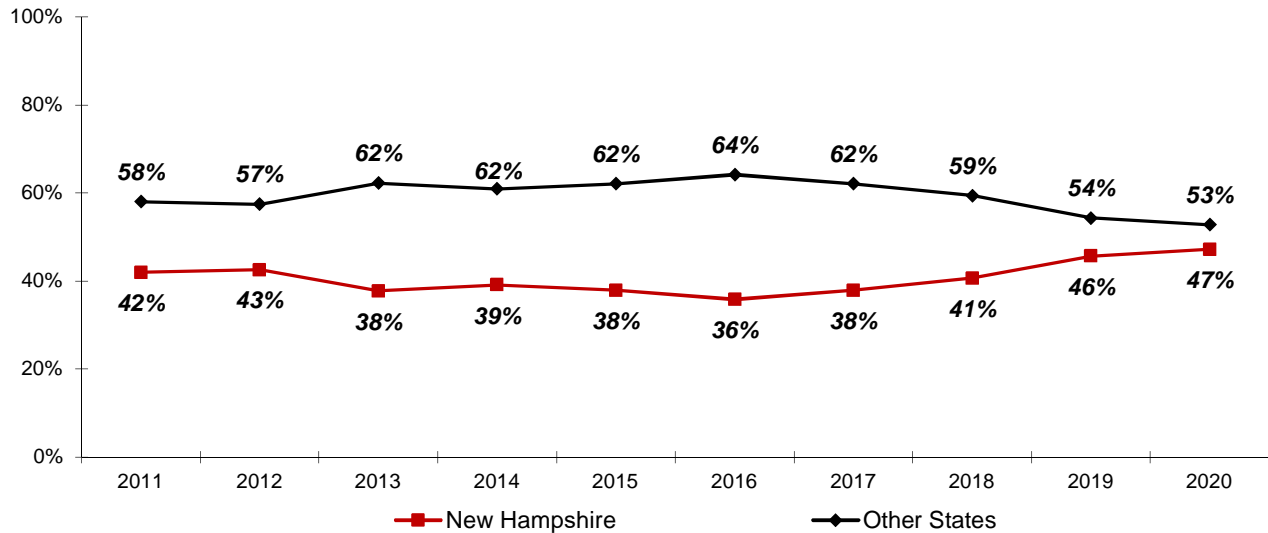

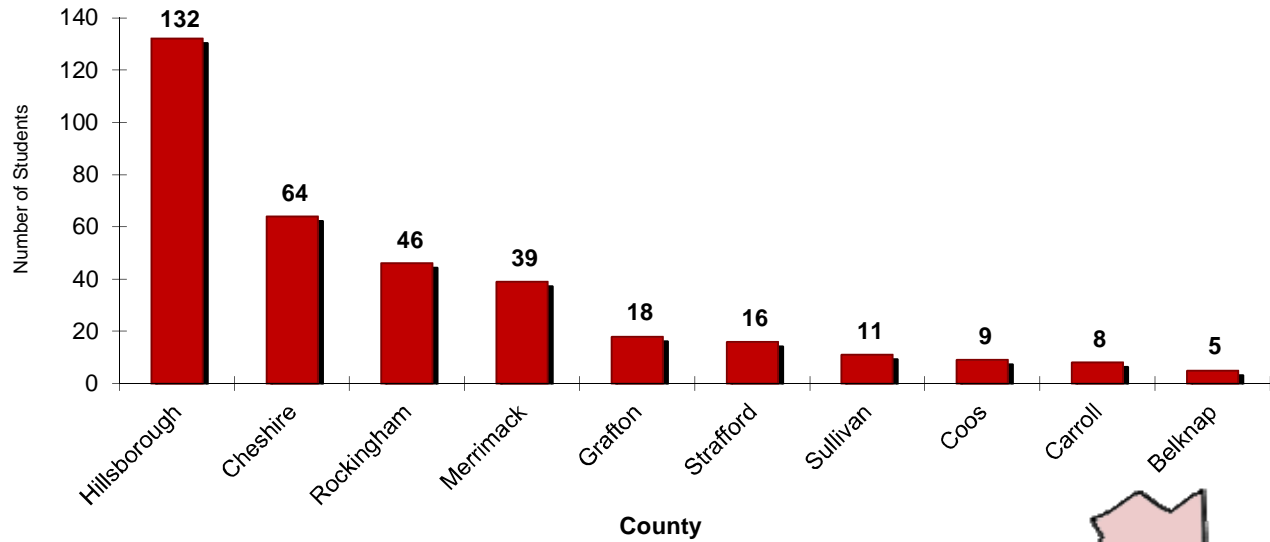

First-Time, First-Year Students



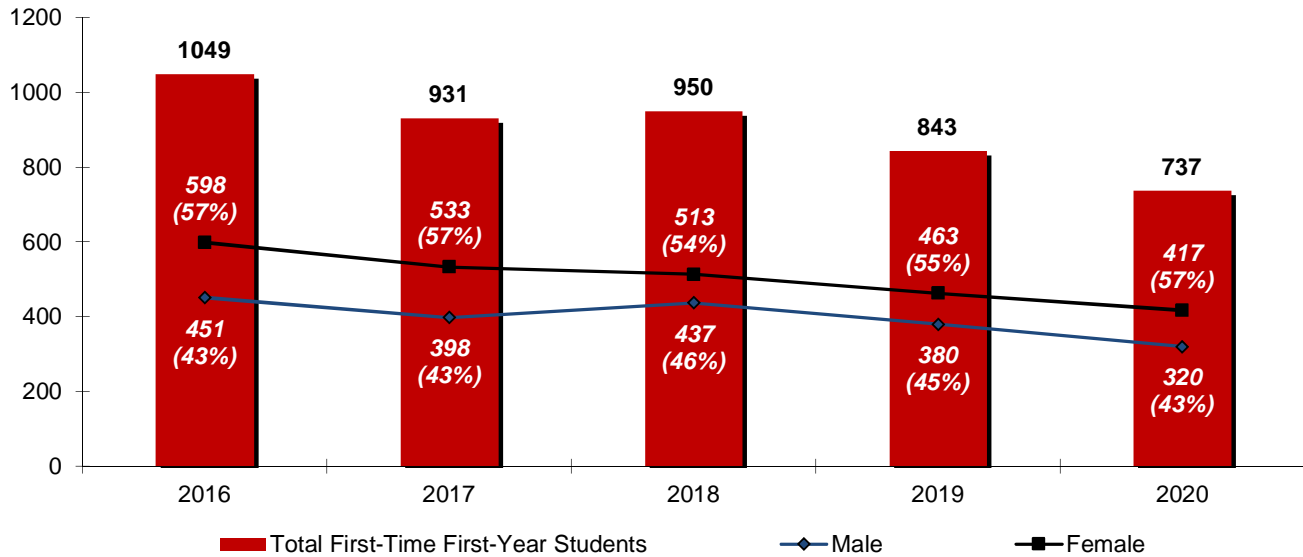

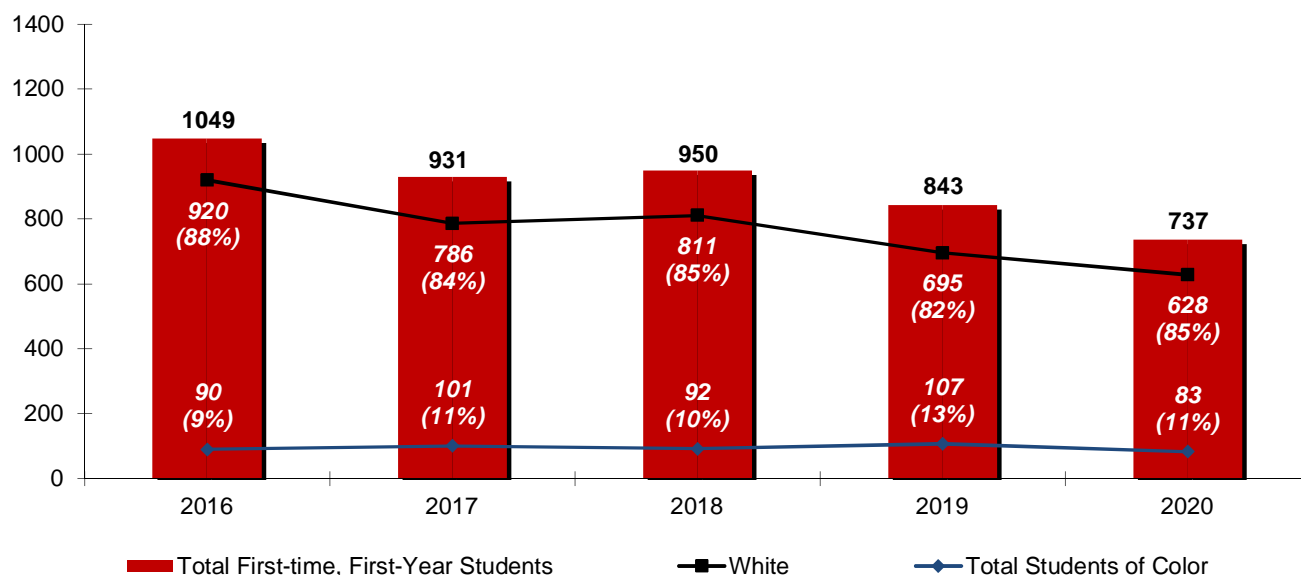

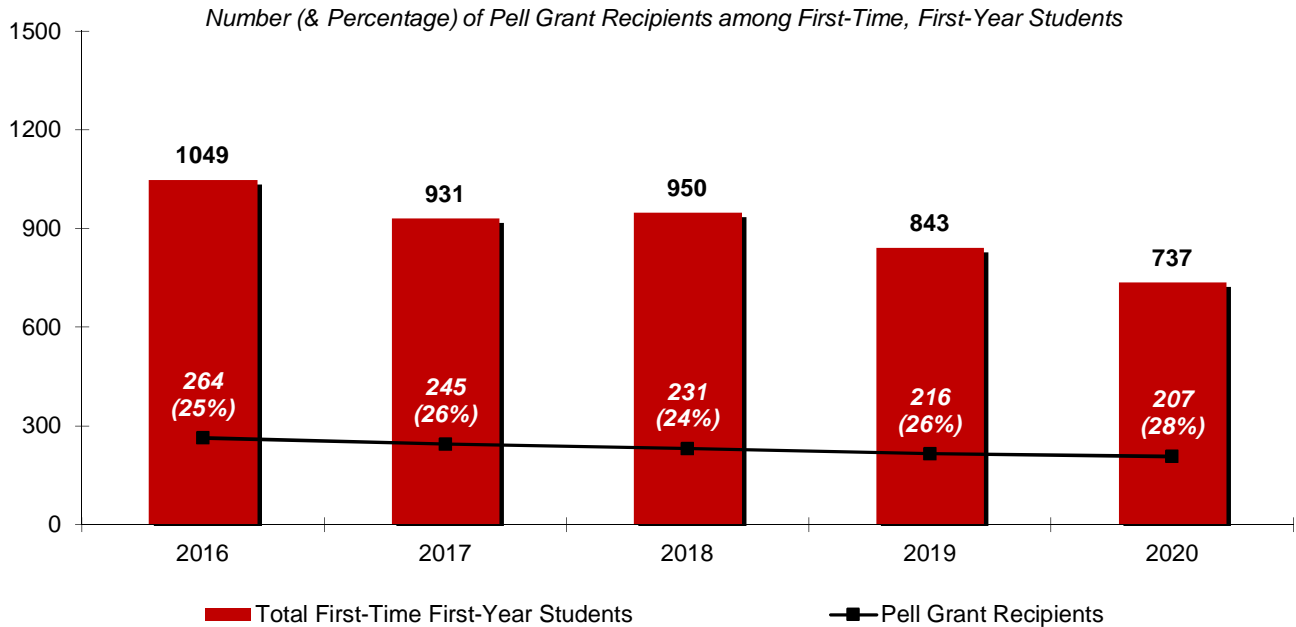

Definitions continued

Continuing Education students are those taking credit-bearing courses but not formally enrolled as degree- or certificate-seeking students.

Full-Time equals a minimum credit load of 12 for an undergraduate or a minimum of 9 for graduate students.

Part-Time equals less than the minimum full-time credit loads for undergraduate or graduate students.

Headcount is the number of students enrolled, regardless of their credit load.

FTE is full-time equivalent students. Each full-time student is counted as one, regardless of how many credits he or she is taking. The credits taken by all part-time students are totaled and divided by the minimum full-time credit load.

FFTE is financial full-time equivalent students. This is total annual tuition and fee revenues divided by the annual tuition rate based on each KSC tuition rate category.

Residency is determined by the legal home state of the student. "Residents" reside within New Hampshire and "non-residents" reside outside of New Hampshire.

Class Levels are based on the number of credits a student has completed - freshmen/first-year students have completed 0-29 credits, sophomores have 30-59, juniors have 60-89, and seniors have 90 or more credits.

Race/Ethnicity is gathered from all students at the point of entry according to federal guidelines. Students who are not US citizens or permanent residents are counted as non-resident aliens and are not included in race/ethnicity data.

First-Generation Students - Students report parental education on their admission application. First-generation students are those for whom neither parent possesses a four-year college degree.

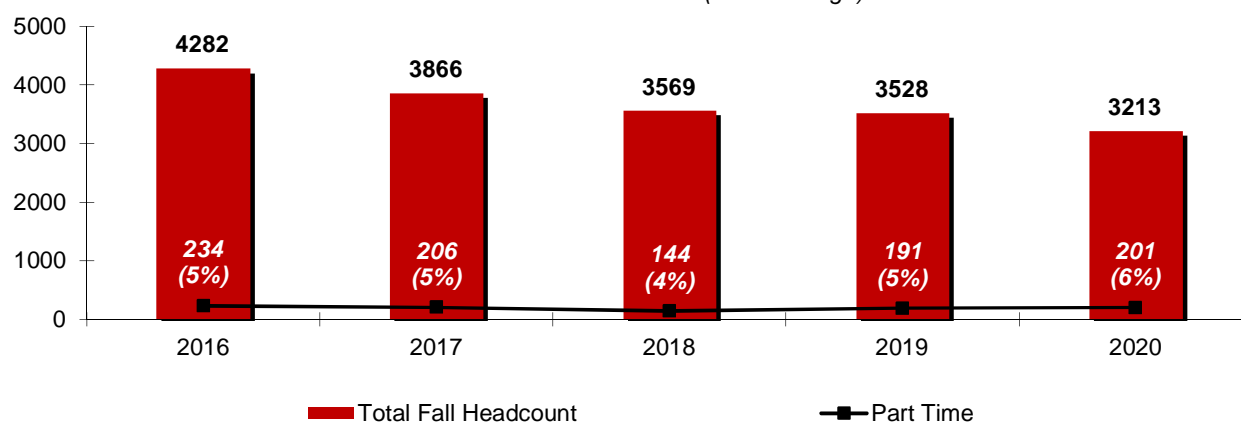

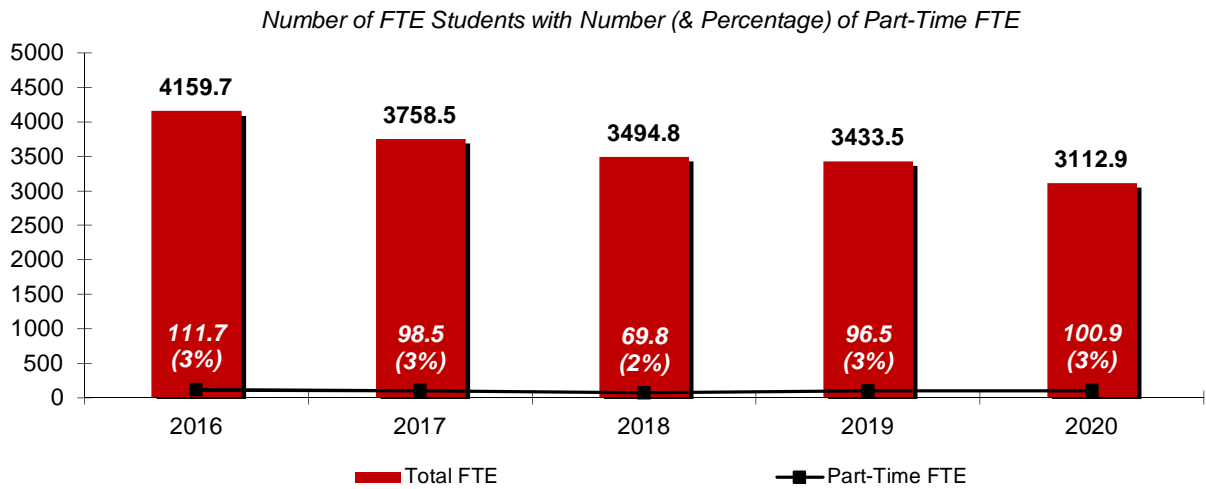

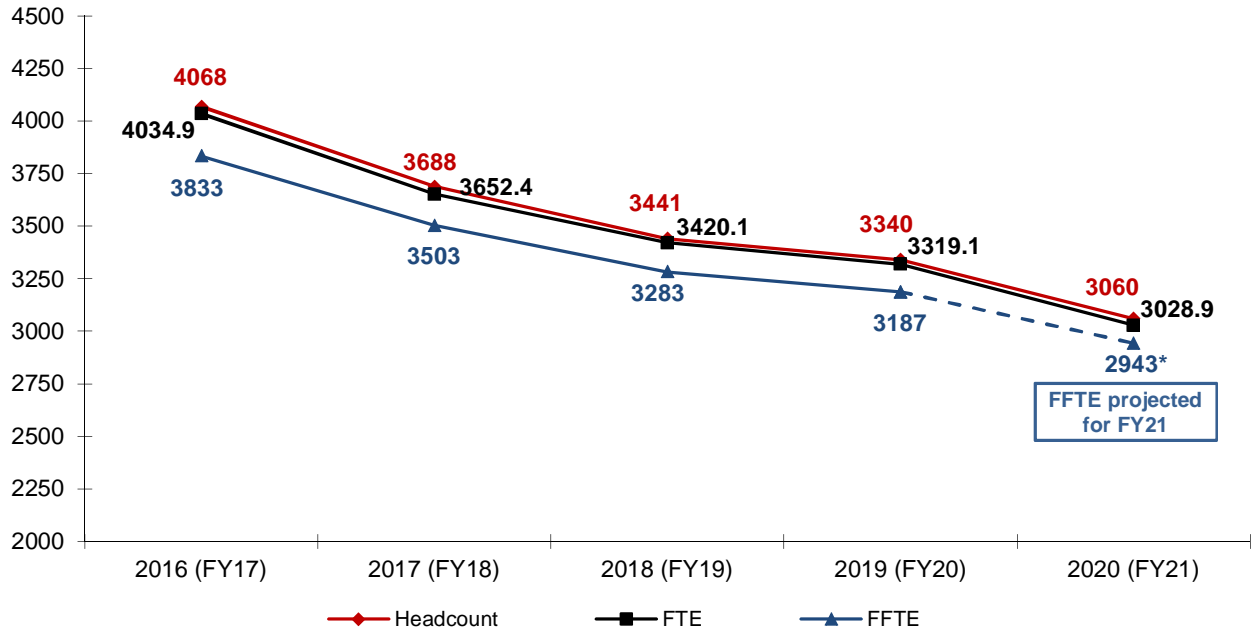

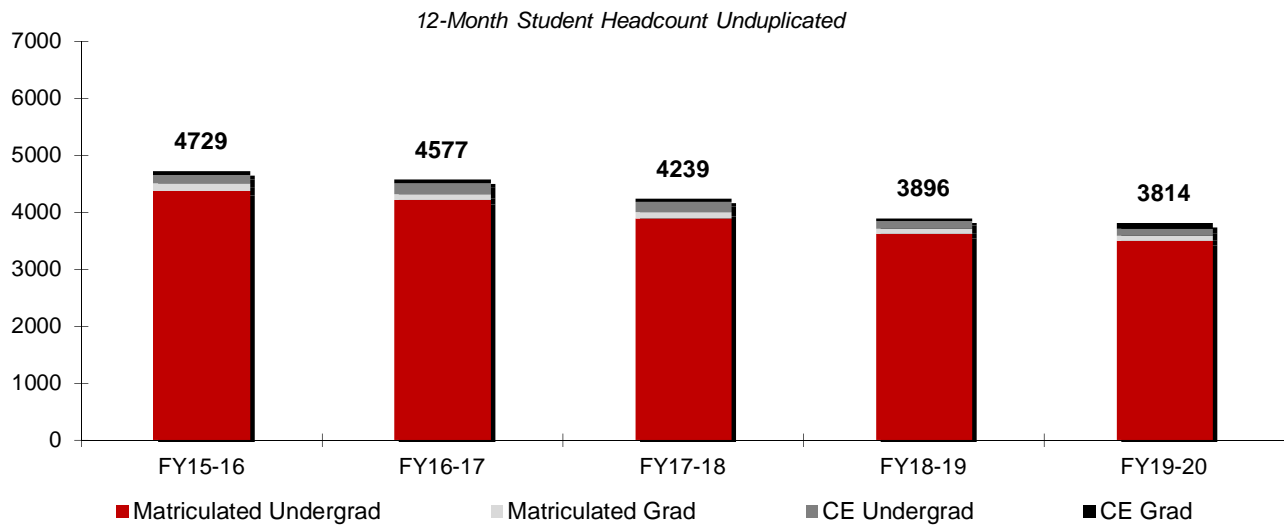

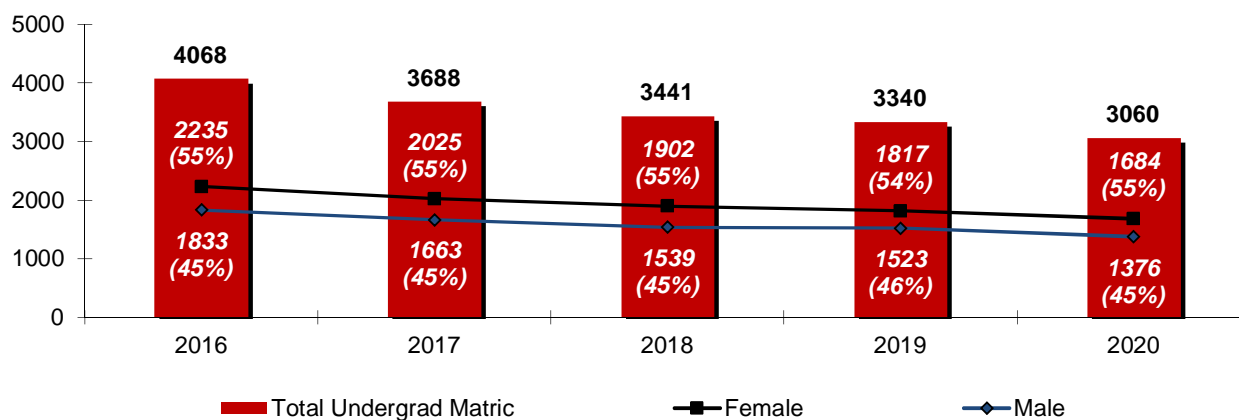
Percent of Matriculated Undergraduate Students by Residency

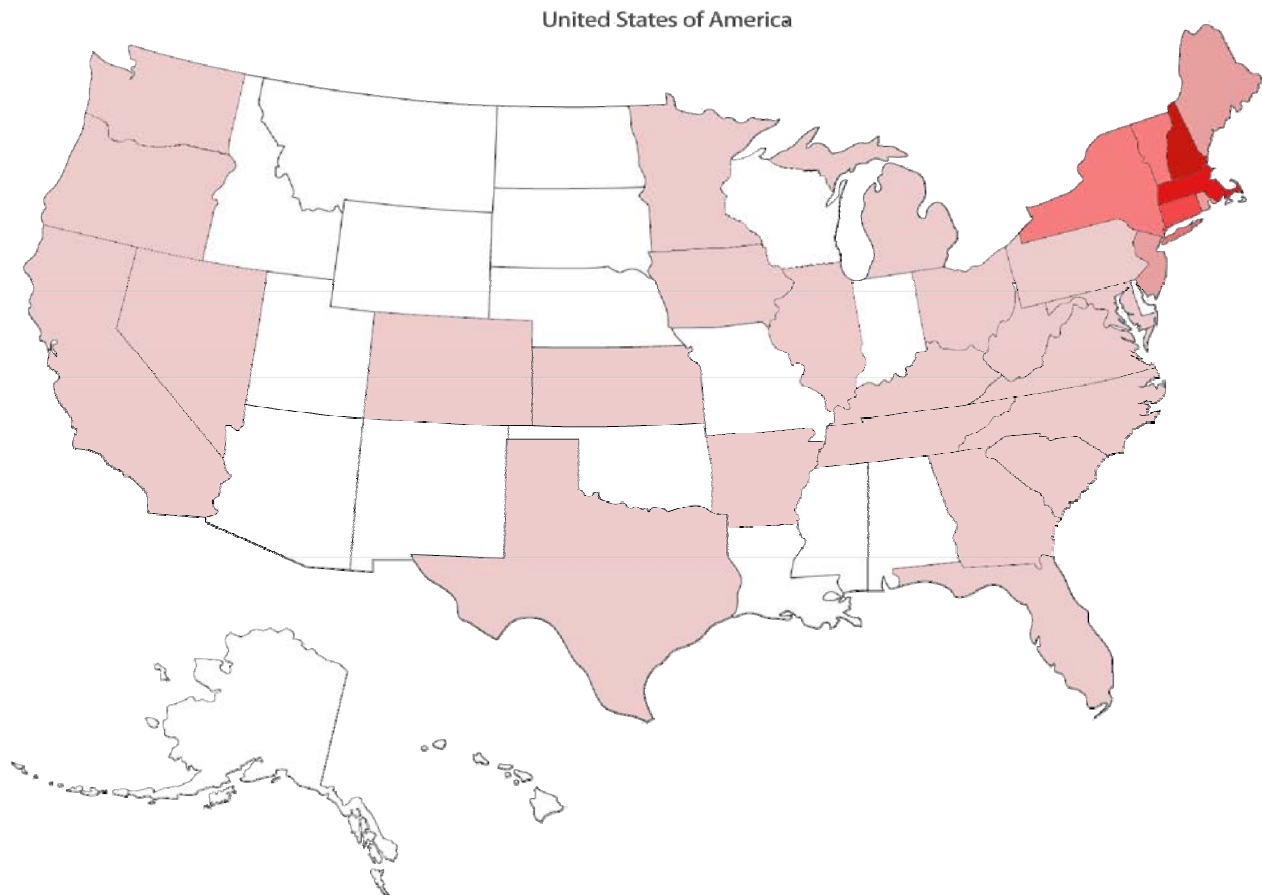

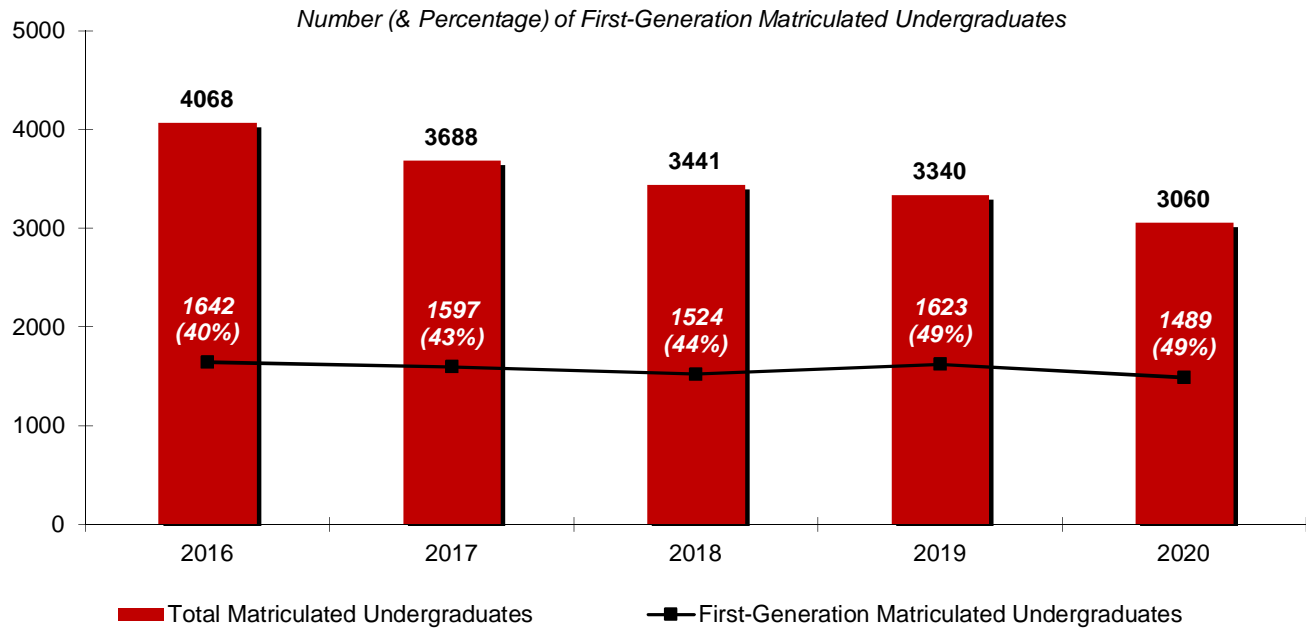

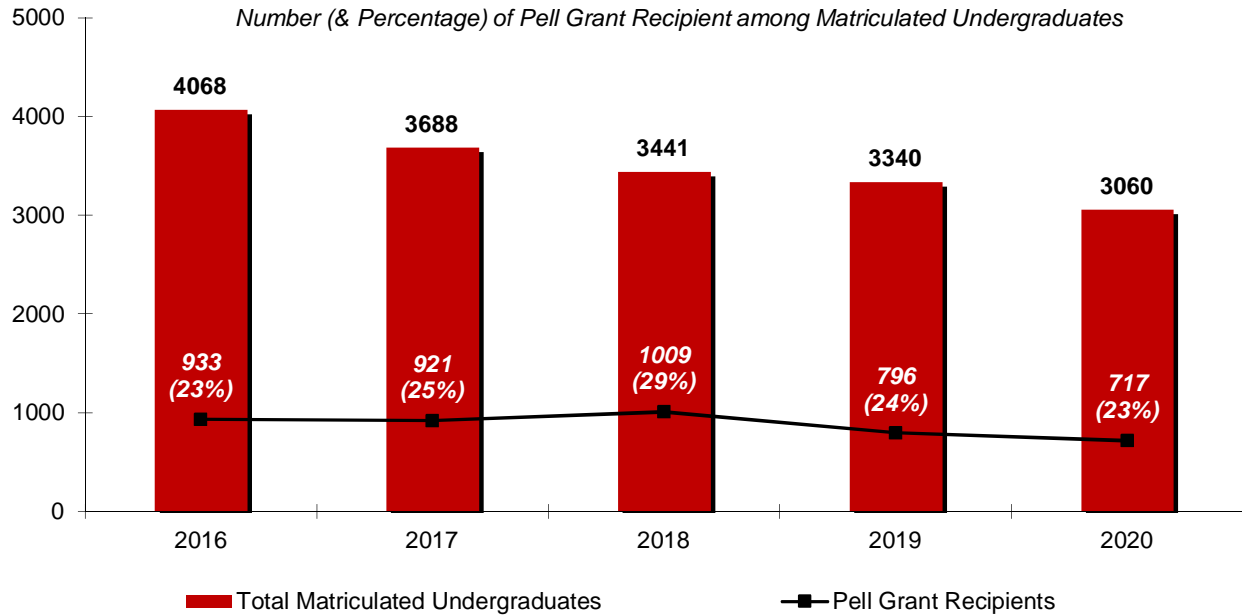

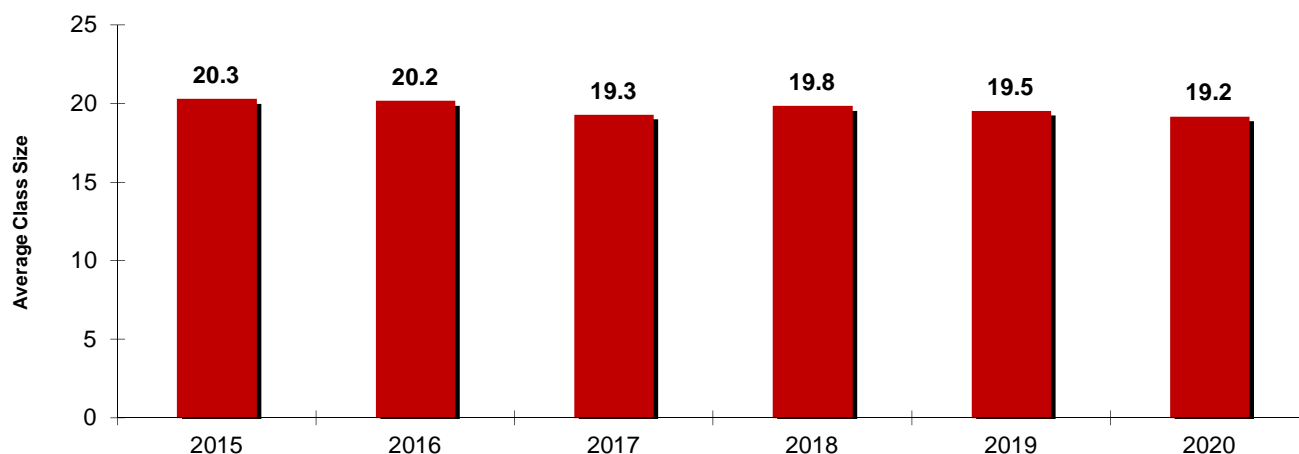

Definitions

Post-Baccalaureates are students with a bachelor's degree returning for teaching certification - counted as undergraduate level students.

Post-Masters are students with a master's degree returning for school principal or school counselor certification - counted as graduate level students.

First-Generation Students - Students report parental education on their admission application. First-generation students are those for whom neither parent possesses a four-year college degree.

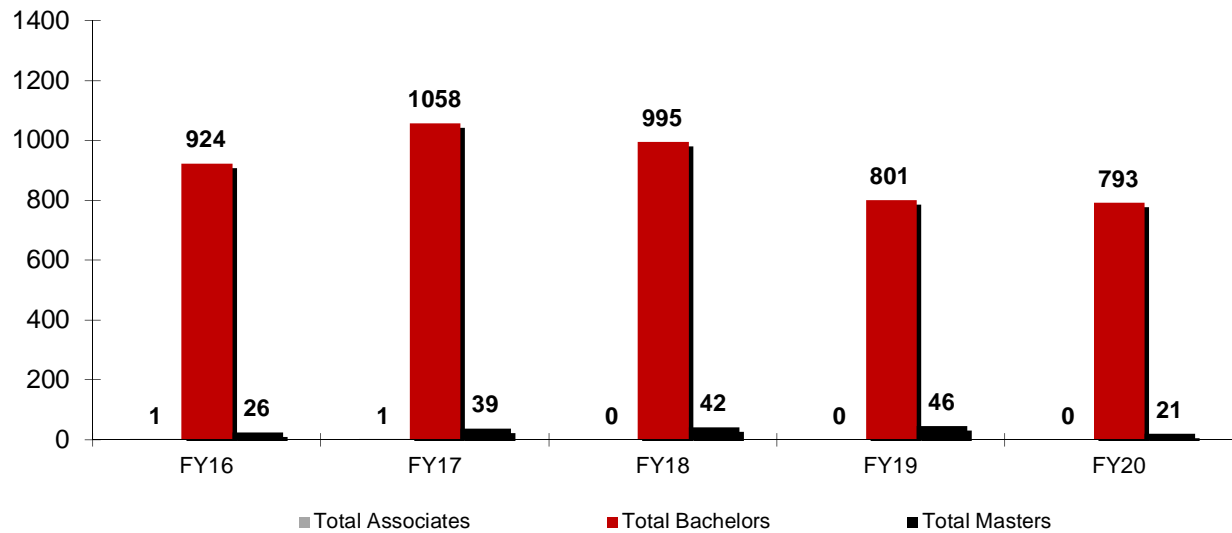

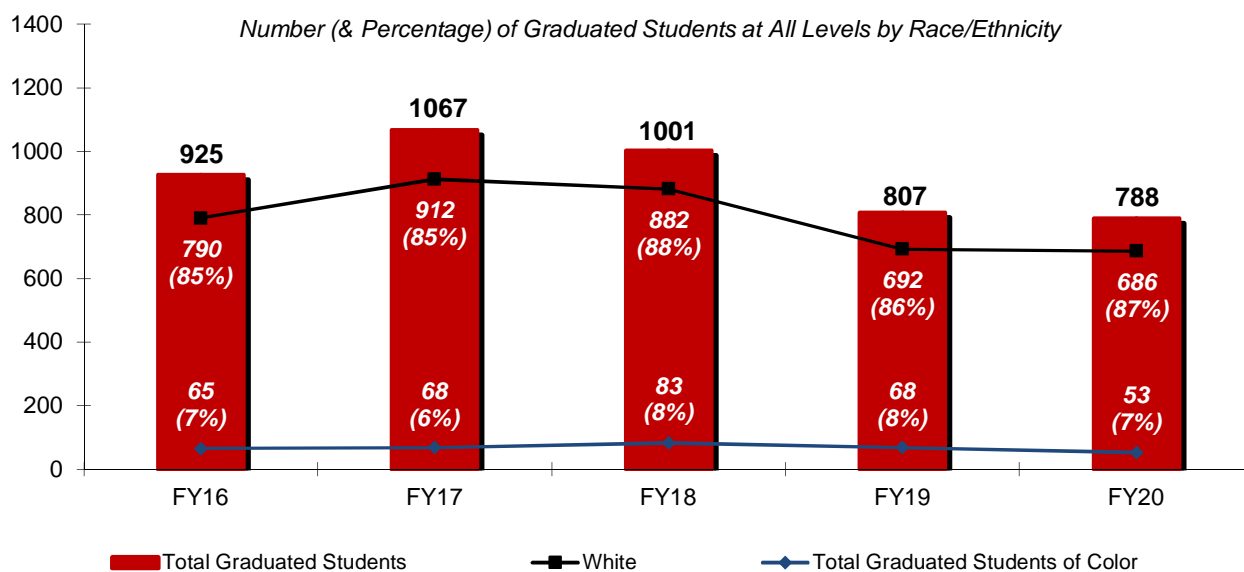

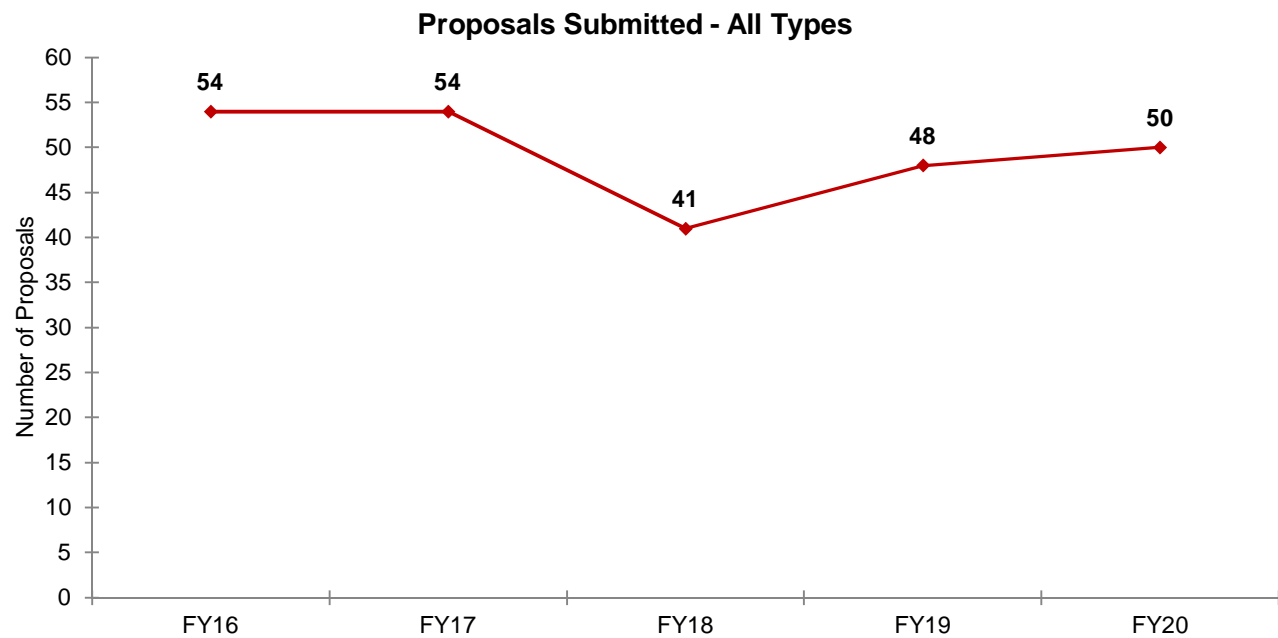

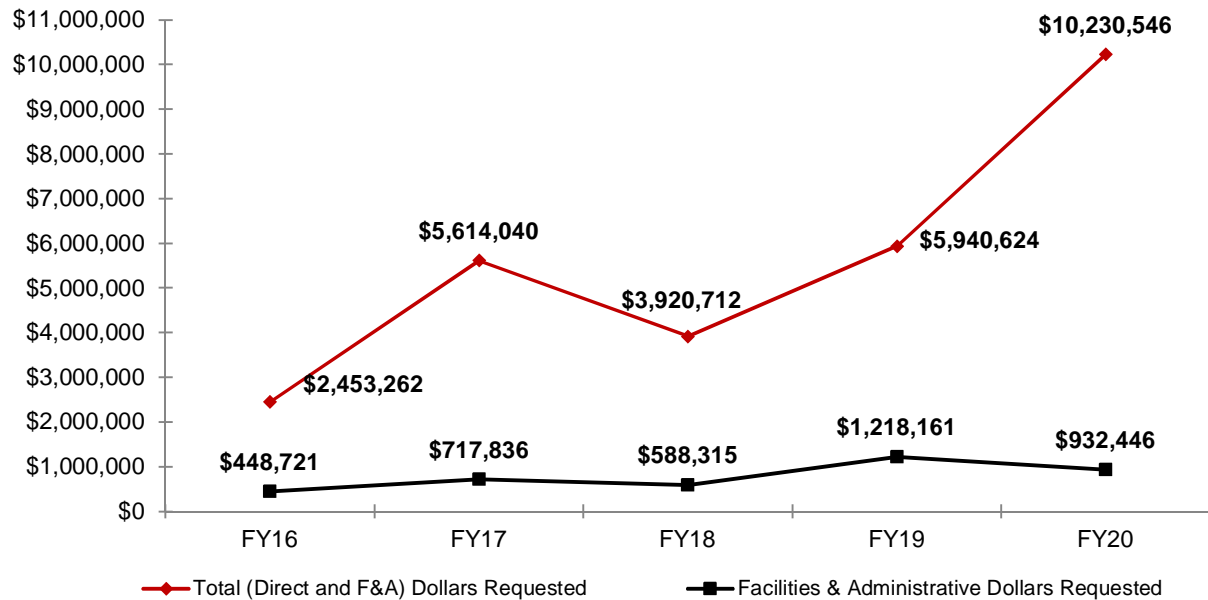

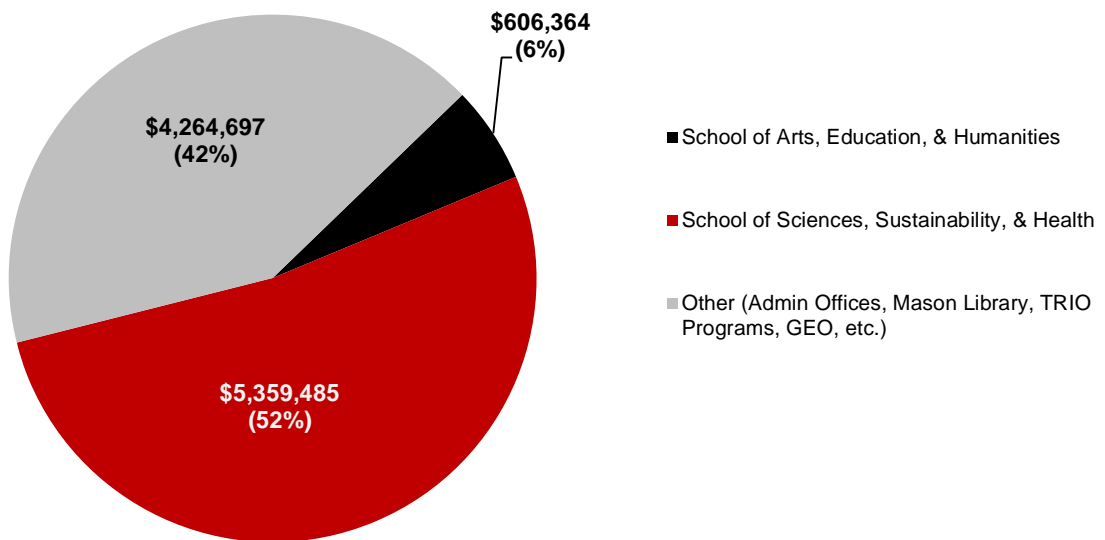

Dollars Requested



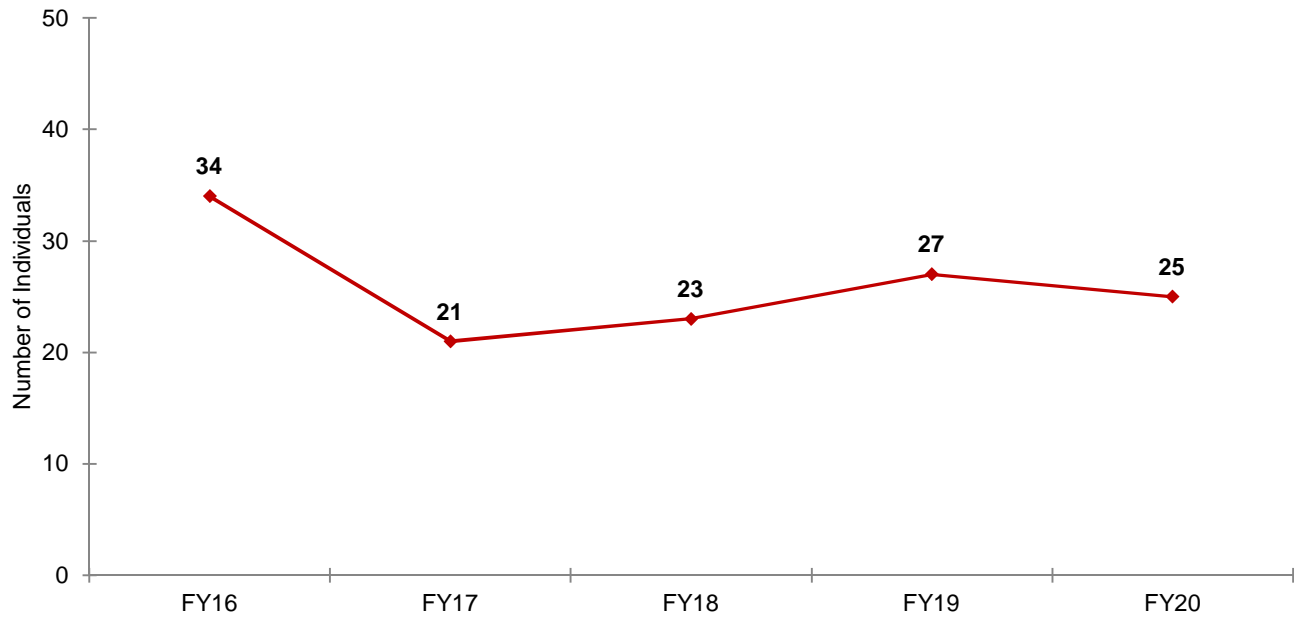

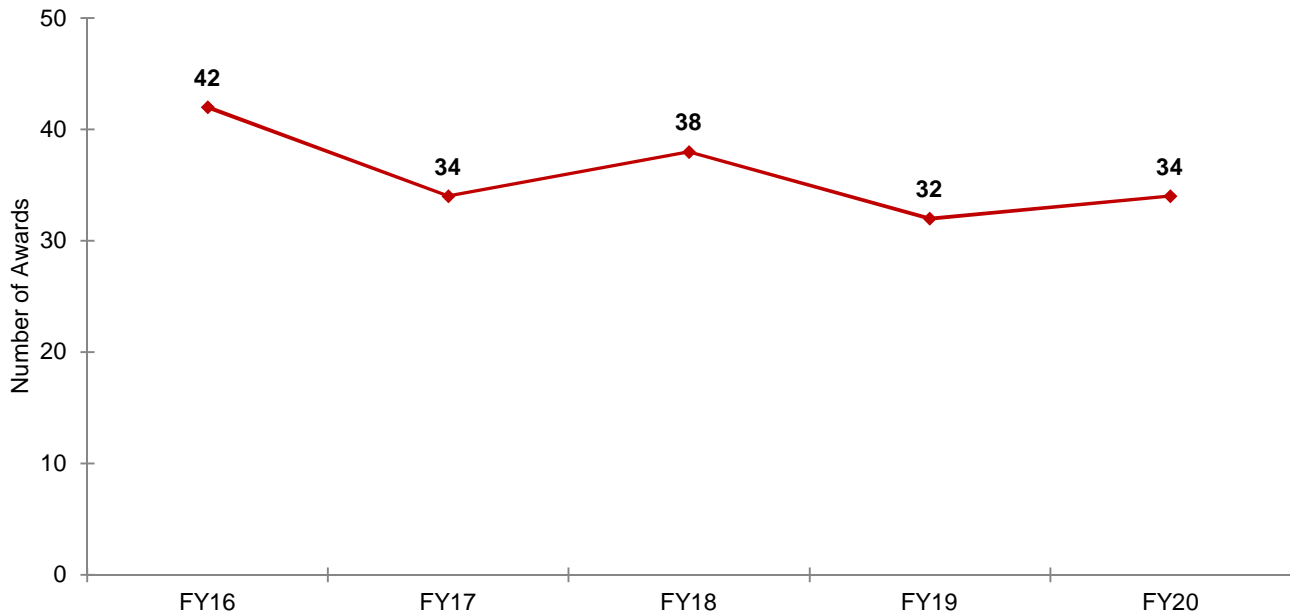

Individuals Involved in at Least One Award

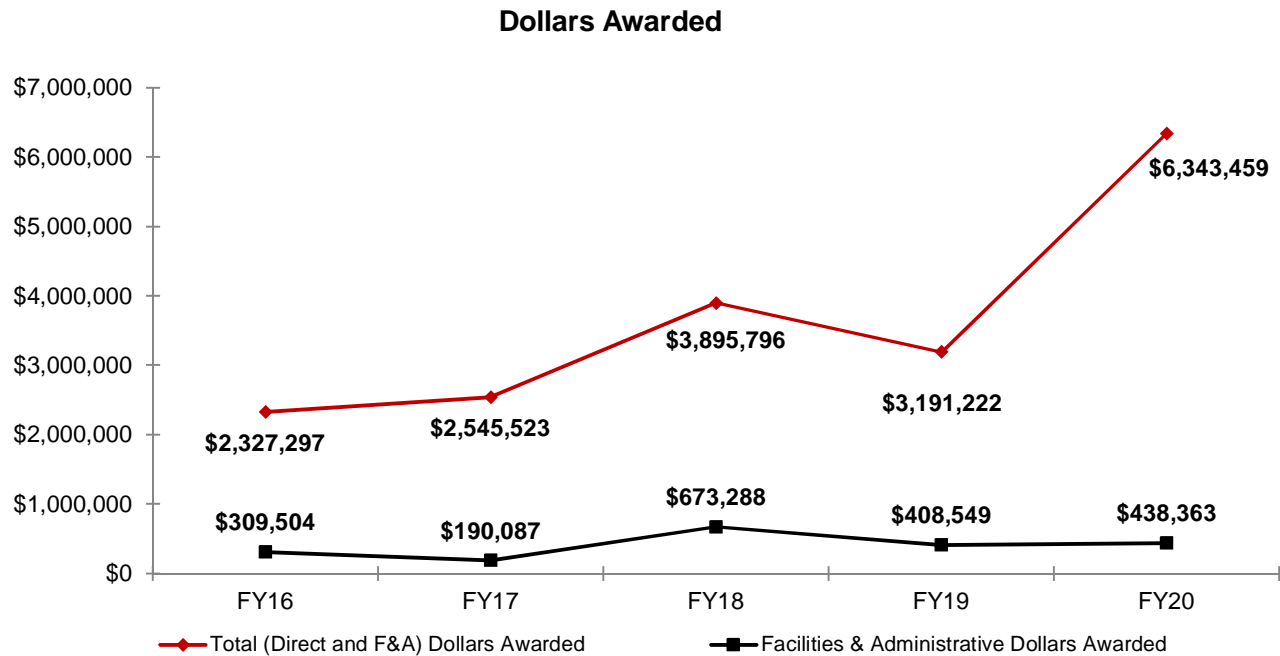


Award Received All Types (Totals)

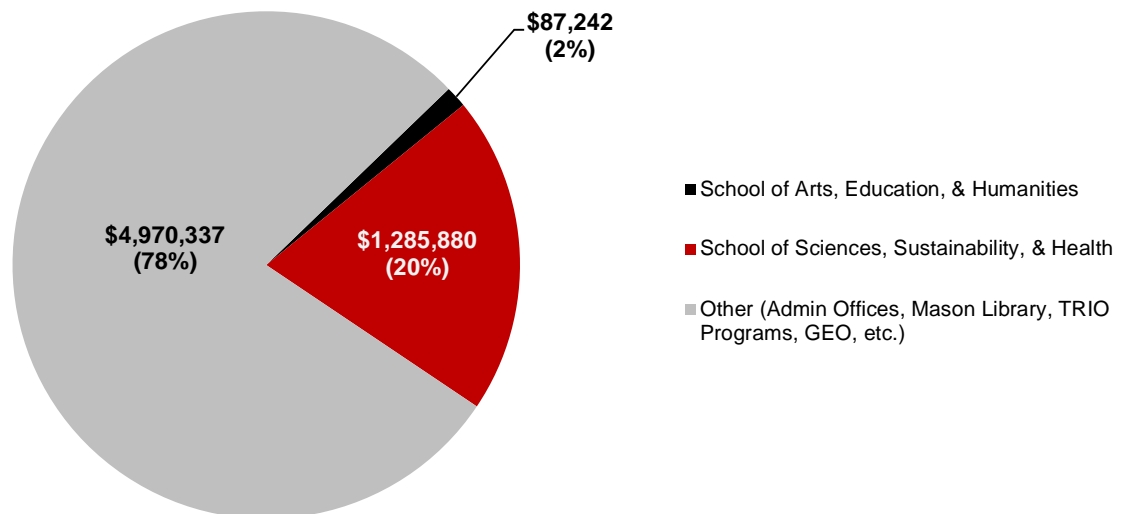

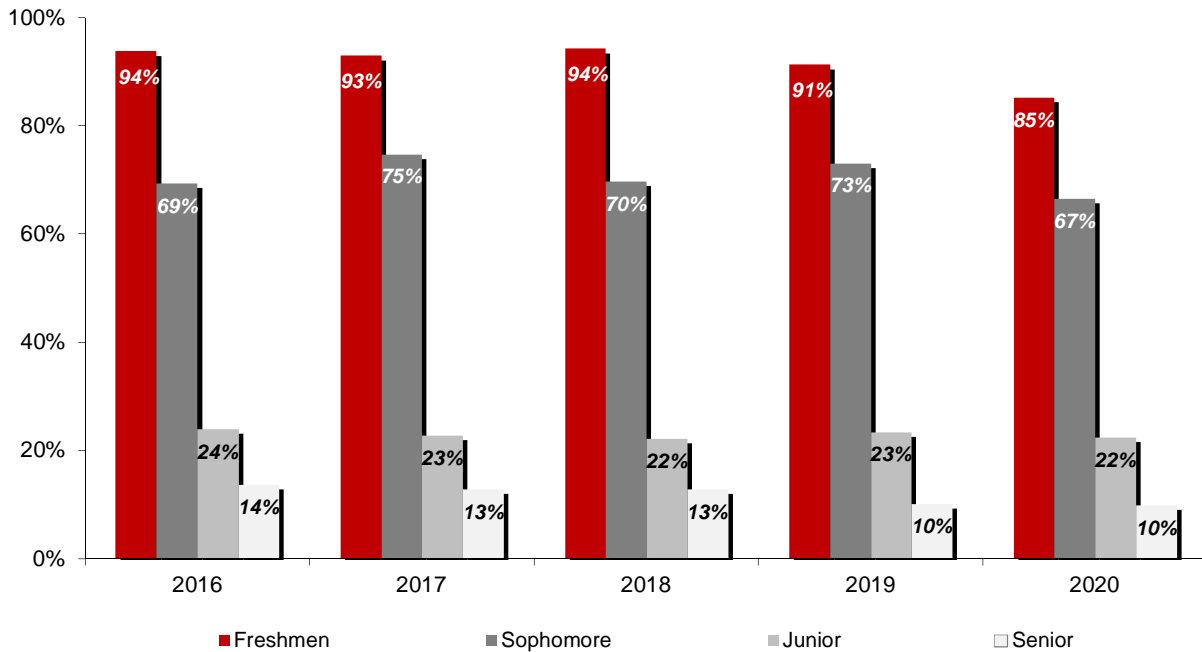

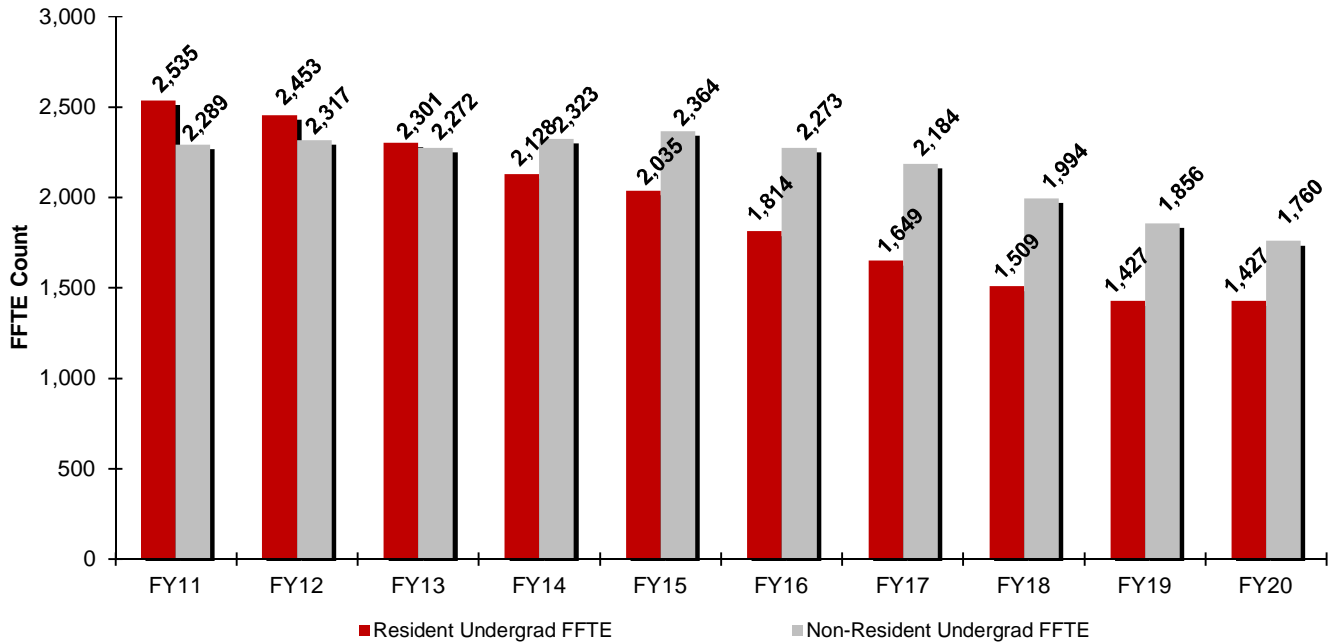
