

# Graduating Students' Responses to Graduating Student Survey

#### Introduction

As students look towards graduating, they reminisce about their college days and make plans for the future. It is an ideal time to ask them how their college experiences contributed to their development and prepared them for their post-graduation plans. The Graduating Student Survey provides students an opportunity to evaluate Keene State Colleges' programs and services and to reflect on their personal and intellectual growth and development.

### Survey Administration

The Office of Student Affairs hosts a Commencement Fair each spring for graduating students. The Fair brings together representatives from all of the services that students may need to work with to complete their graduation preparations. Students are asked to complete the on-line Commencement Participation Form and Survey prior to being admitted to the Commencement Fair.

In spring 2010, 961 students completed the Graduating Student Survey prior to attending the commencement ceremonies. These students were awarded 25 Associates' degrees, 978 bachelors' degrees and 28 Masters' degrees. This report will focus on the bachelor's degree recipients.

#### **Student Characteristics**

Sixty-two percent of the bachelor's degree students were women. Four percent were non-white. Their median age was 23 years and their average cumulative grade point average was 3.15. Fifty-four percent of graduates are New Hampshire residents. Seventy-six percent originally entered Keene State College as first-time, first-year freshmen and 36% were first-generation students. A summary of student characteristics is presented in Table 1.

# Degrees Awarded

Students participating in the commencement ceremonies were recognized for their achievements in 860 single program areas and 65 in dual program areas (Table 2). The majority of the dual degrees (32) were in Education.

#### Student Satisfaction and Commitment

The Spring 2010 graduating class resembled the 2008¹ class in their overall satisfaction and commitment to the college (Table 3). Ninety percent of the students said that they were satisfied to very satisfied with their Keene State College education, 87% would recommend Keene State to others and 78% would choose to attend Keene State if they had to do it over again.



# KSC Contribution to Knowledge, Skills and Personal Growth

Students were asked to rate how their learning experiences at Keene State College contributed to their knowledge, skills, and personal development, figure 1 summarizes these responses.

Figure 1: Contribution to Knowledge, Skills and Personal Growth




# Student Engagement and Employment




Figure 3: During the past year, how many times did you do each of the following?

Students were asked about their typical participation in certain activities and events during the past year. The responses are summarized in the bullets below and represented in Figures 2 and 3.

- 40% of students worked on-campus, 54% worked off-campus.
- 86% spent 6 or more hours per week studying or preparing for classes.
- 44% spent from 1 to 5 hours per week studying or preparing for classes in the Mason Library.
- 58% spent 1 to 5 hours per week commuting to classes.
- 13% of students were providing care for dependents living with them.
- 89% had attended a film, performance, lecture or other cultural event on campus at least once during the academic year.
- 79% had attended a social event sponsored by a campus organization at least once during the academic year.
- 64% had attended an athletic event at least once during the academic year.

Figure 2. During the past year, about how many hours did you spend, in a typical 7-day week, doing each of the following?

# Student's Evaluation of the Learning Environment at Keene State College

Graduating students were asked "How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statements about the learning environment at KSC?". Students often agreed or strongly agreed that their instructors were concerned about their academic development (88%), and that KSC provides support for them to succeed academically (88%).

## Service Learning and Community Service

Fifty-seven percent (531) of the graduating students reported that they had taken at least one course that incorporated a service learning component. Sixty-four percent of these students took two or more service learning courses. Their evaluations of these experiences are presented in Figure 5. Eighty-four percent of the students feel the service learning aspects of the courses they have taken have helped them to see how the subject matter learned can be used in everyday life. 83% would encourage other students to take service learning courses.

Graduating students were also asked whether they had volunteered their time to engage in a community service project sponsored by a Keene State College club or organization during the past their time at KSC – 40% (375) responded that they had. Ninety percent of these students reported they had participated in community service activities in the past year. The hours that these students reported spending in their voluntary service are summarized in Table 5.

The service learning aspects of the courses I have taken have helped me to see how 84% the subject matter I learned can be used in everyday life As a result of my service learning experience, I would encourage other students to 83% take courses that offer service learning. My community service activities will help me in my future career plans.

# Plans Following Graduation






Figure 6: Immediate plans following graduation

Students were asked about their immediate plans following graduation. Forty-nine percent plan to work in their field while another 60% indicated that they would be seeking a position in their field of study. Students were asked to choose all statements that applied to their future plans so many students are counted in multiple categories as summarized in Figure 6. For those students that indicated they would be working in their field after graduation Figure 7 shows the geographic location they will be working in. Figure 8 presents the area of study for those students indicating that they will be entering graduate school upon graduation.
