Each year since 1990, Keene State College has administered a survey to its graduating students. In the past, this survey has been done at graduation rehearsal, which was typically held the day before graduation. This year, rehearsal was eliminated, so a variety of other means were used to contact graduating students. A copy of the Senior Survey was placed on the WWW, with links to it from the Institutional Research page and the commencement page. Two e-mails were sent to students submitting intent to graduate forms with links to the on-line survey. The bookstore staff handed out surveys to students when they picked up their caps and gowns. Surveys were also available at various locations around campus. A table was set up in the Student Center atrium for two weeks during the lunch hour for students to fill in surveys. Finally, surveys were handed out at the senior barbeque and at the Saturday banquet. In total, 246 survey were returned, a rate of 25%. This is a lower rate than in the past, which is usually 40 - 50% of students graduating.

*Some noteworthy facts from the survey:* 

#### Satisfaction

Eighty-eight percent of the students graduating in 2000 said that they were satisfied with their education. This is down 2% from last year's survey. Seventy-five percent of the students felt that they would still attend KSC if they could start over. This is up 4% from last year's survey. Last year's figures were 90% and 71% respectively.

#### Plans

Forty-six percent of the respondents plan to work full-time in the fall. This figure fluctuates each year with the national economic and employment figures. As expected, full-time employment figures are down 6% from last year. Correspondingly, the percentage of students seeking employment is up slightly (45% compared with 41% last year). Crotched Mountain, Brattleboro Retreat, Otter Brook Treatment Center, and PC Connection each hired several KSC students. Other students are working at such diverse jobs as an educator in a museum, a campus minister, a furniture maker apprentice, and a visitation supervisor at a prison.

#### **Graduate School**

The number of students planning to go to graduate school remained exactly the same as last year -- (10%). This is equivalent to our six year high of 10% in 1998. Our figures for graduate school enrollment typically range between 8.5% and 10.5%. The rates for graduate school enrollment appear to be slightly higher in the years when the full-time employment rates are also higher. While many students are remaining in the area to attend school at Keene State or Antioch, some are traveling a significant distance. This year students are pursuing their education at institutions as far away as Texas A&M, Indiana University, and the University of Nebraska.

#### **College Services**

One section of the Senior Survey asks students to indicate how they feel about various college policies and services. Slightly more than 83% of our students agree that, "faculty at Keene State are concerned about student learning and development." Most students (71%) agree or strongly agree that a general education program should continue to be required by the college. Evaluating this section as a trend, we learn that an increasing number of students feel that "a general education program should continue to be required" and that "the college provides support for students in academic difficulty". The advising system, both in the Elliot Center, and in the individual majors, is getting higher marks from the students than ever before.

#### **Evident Gains**

Students felt that their education greatly enhanced their capacities to: "gain in-depth knowledge of a field" (54.5%); "function independently without supervision" (53.3%); "acquire new skills and knowledge on my own" (48.4%); "exercise personal responsibility" (48.4%); and "understand oneself: abilities, interests, limitations, and personality" (47.6%). Students responded similarly last year.

#### No Enhancement

Students also indicate the skills they feel were not enhanced at all by their education at Keene State College. Often, one of the areas least enhanced has been preparation for graduate school. This year, "prepare for graduate or professional school" slips down again: 15.4% of students felt that there was no enhancement, compared with only 12% last year. Only 17.6% of the students felt that KSC greatly enhanced their preparation for graduate school, compared with 26% in 2000. In addition, students most often reported no enhancement in their capacities to: "read or speak a foreign language" (51.2%, down from 54.9% in 2000); "appreciate art, literature, music, and drama" (10.6%, down from last year's 14.0%); and "relate well to people of different races, nations, religions, and values" (16.7%, up from 11.3% in 2000). This last response ties in with the increased number of students mentioning the lack of diversity as an issue in the comments.

#### **Valuable Courses**

The "most valuable courses in the major" are the courses that most closely relate to the future jobs within that major. Typically, education capstone classes top the list, which is not unexpected due to the large number of education students we graduate each year. For the past six years, Student Teaching has been rated the most valuable class. This year, it was replaced by Methods classes. This is the first year that Business Policy has not been on the list, although Social, Legal, and Political Environments of Business was on the list. Organization and Administration of Safety Programs is on the list every year. Psychology and Communications classes are more popular than ever before, as their majors continue to grow in size. Amond the "most valuable general education courses", students typically find English Composition, which is required for all students, the most valuable. In addition, General Psychology, Sociology, Introduction to Art, and Communications courses are frequently mentioned.

#### What Should Not be Changed

Each year, we ask students what they feel should not be changed on campus. "the faculty" and "Greek life" are two of the most common responses. In 1990 and 1991, "the Pub" was the most frequently mentioned. In 1993, "Division II athletics" became the most often occurring responses. In 1995, the campus physical appearance was most often mentioned as something that the students were pleased about. In 1996 and 1997, one of the most common responses was the success of the new Student Center. In 1998 it was a tie between "general education" and "the college atmosphere" and in 1999, the most frequent positive responses was "the Aspire program." In 2000, the look of the campus and its buildings received far more responses than any other area, with nine people quoted as saying, "the campus is beautiful." In 2001, the look of the campus and the campus size were both mentioned often. Several people specifically mentioned the wonderful jobs done by the grounds crew. The Elliot Center had even more positive comments than in the past, with all services receiving mention. Various campus activities and events received positive recognition, with most people mentioning social events and volunteer opportunities.

#### What Should be Changed


In each of the eleven years that we have done this survey, academic advising, availability of classes, faculty, communication between administrative offices, parking, and the dining commons have been mentioned frequently as areas that students feel need improvement. This year we noticed some changes. Communication between offices, while still mentioned, did not have as many negative comments as customer service and respect from administrative offices. Parking had more comments than in the past (thirty-three compared with eleven last year). Most of those were concerned about the amount of parking available, but seven students were upset about the cost of decals and tickets. There were fewer complaints about the food in the Dining Commons than ever before (only two), but many more complaints about overcrowding or needing a larger dining facility.

#### What Should be Changed, continued

Over time, certain concerns appear for a year or two then diminish in importance or disappear entirely. In 1990, communication between administration and students was one of the concerns most often cited. Complaints about poor faculty replaced this concern in 1991 and were in turn replaced by concerns about faculty pay and the contract dispute in 1993. In 1992, lack of parking on campus was the biggest issue. Parking became less of a complaint after the Winchester Street lot was built in 1993. In 1994, the need for improved library resources was the major concern, to be supplanted by worry about the availability of computers and computer classes in 1995. Also in 1994, a substantial number of students suggested that Keene State spend less money on aesthetics and more on academics. In 1995, these comments were replaced by positive comments about the look of the campus. In 1996, comments about availability of computers and concerns about spending too much money on aesthetics in lieu of academics, were again the most frequent concerns. In the 1997 survey, students continued to comment on the importance of academics over aesthetics, and the unavailability of parking. Among the 1998 survey, major concerns were the importance of extended library and computer center hours and the need for better career services. In the 1999 survey, major concerns were improvement of communication between the Student Financial Management, Bursar, and Registrar areas, and the reinstatement of Senior Week. Last year (2000), athletic facilities surfaced as an issue, along with improved communication, particularly with off-campus students. We also found that an increased number of education students would like to have their student teaching experience much earlier in their college career.


This year (2001), an increased number of students mentioned the need for new athletic facilities. A new concern was the Science Center. A large number of students wanted a new or renovated Science Center Two students would be satisfied if the current Science Center just had more comfortable chairs. Extended building hours in the Arts Center, computer labs, library, and Dining Commons were mentioned by a total of nineteen students, far more than ever before. Twice as many students as last year were concerned about the lack of diversity on campus. Now that the library renovations are complete, there are even more complaints about out-dated library resources. A total of twenty-seven students commented on the General Education requirements. The students were fairly evenly divided between wanting fewer General Education classes, and suggesting new or revised requirements. One area that concerned us, because it had never been mentioned before, was overcrowding. Four students mentioned that the campus "felt overcrowded" to them, in addition to the students who specifically mentioned overcrowding in the parking areas, Dining Commons, or Residential Life halls.















# Frequency Distributions of Student Attendance at Performances at the Arts Center





# Frequency Distributions of Student Attendance at Films at the Putnam Lecture Hall





# Frequency Distributions of Student Attendance at SAC Events





# Frequency Distributions of the Number of Movies Students Attended Elsewhere in Keene





# Frequency Distributions of the Number of Hours Students Spent Watching Television









- Better academic advising. I met with my advisor twice. I almost didn't graduate because of 1 credit.
- Let us know when classes aren't offered both semesters so we can plan around it.
- Improve major selection process
- I feel it should be mandatory for students to select and advisor, regardless of major or undecided, freshman year. I took so many classes I didn't need to take because I didn't have proper guidance. The only thing I would suggest changing, you already have. Start freshmen off with advisors and when
- they are ready they can change. I had several problems that could have been avoided if you had started this earlier.
- Emphasize strongly the importance of planning out an academic program to Freshman/Sophomores.
- Advisors should be assigned to you as a freshman.
- Advisors as soon as you get into the college.
- Portfolio development as Freshmen.
