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Summary

This spring semester, Keene State again administered a survey to its graduating students. This year's survey was by far the most successful, with 757 students responding, a response rate of over 90%. In addition to being the most successful Graduating Student Survey, it was also the most well received web based survey ever administered by the college, with 262 students responding on-line.

Some noteworthy facts from the survey:

Plans

More students plan to attend graduate school than ever before, 13.9% compared with 10.4% last year. One might speculate that graduate school figures increase during periods of economic downturn, but Graduating Student Survey data did not find that to be true during the recession of the early 1990s. Some of the most popular graduate schools include the University of Massachusetts at Lowell, Springfield College, University of New Hampshire, Central and Southern Connecticut State Universities, and Plymouth and Keene State Colleges.

The current economic recession does appear to be reflected in this year's employment figures. Only 37% of students reported that they would be working full-time after graduation, compared with 42% last year. However, the wording of the question was changed slightly from last year's survey to make it clearer. Last year's survey asked student's status "beginning next fall". This year's question asked, "after graduating". This may have had an impact on the results as well. National Grange Mutual Insurance, Bank North, Bank of New Hampshire, Keene High and Monadnock Regional High School each employed at least two of our graduates this year.

Satisfaction

There continues to be a small decrease in student's satisfaction levels. This year, 80% percent of the students graduating said they were satisfied with their education, compared with a high of nearly 90% in 2000. Of the students that were dissatisfied, over 40% reported that it was because they were unhappy with their major in some way ("didn't like the department" and "felt unprepared for a career" were two common responses). Over 9% of the students reporting dissatisfaction admit that they could have made more of an effort to have a satisfactory college experience.

The number of students who said that they would attend KSC if given the opportunity to start over decreased slightly as well, to 64%. Last year, 68% of students would choose KSC again. As in previous years, students who would not return to Keene State would prefer a school in a different location (typically in a larger city or farther from home).

College Services

One section of the Senior Survey asks students to indicate how they feel about various college policies and services. Approximately 81% of our students agree that, "faculty at Keene State are concerned about student learning and development." More students than ever before (81.7%) agreed or strongly agreed that the atmosphere at Keene State College emphasizes academics and supports intellectual development. Most students (69%) agree or strongly agree that a general education program should continue to be required by the college.

Summary

Evident Gains

Students felt that their education *moderately or greatly enhanced* their capacities to: "gain in-depth knowledge of a field" (88.9%); "function independently without supervision" (86.3%); and gave them a greater "appreciation of the importance of personal responsibility" (86.6%).

There was a decrease from last year in the number of students who felt that their education *moderately or greatly enhanced* their "preparation for graduate or professional school". These results are surprising given the large numbers of students going on to graduate school.

No Enhancement

Students also indicate the skills they feel were not enhanced at all by their education at Keene State College. Students most often report *no enhancement* in their capacities to: "read or speak a foreign language" (59.1%). In looking at "activities engaged in by students in the past year", 57% of our students reported "often" or "almost always" remaining on campus over the weekend. This is up considerably from last year's response of 49%. There were corresponding increases in the number of students participating in intramural sports and student government. Students also reported attending more performances at the Arts Center, seeing more films at the Putnam Lecture hall, and participating in more SAC-sponsored events than in previous years.

Valuable Courses

The "most valuable courses in the major" are the courses that most closely relate to future jobs within that major. Typically, education capstone classes top the list, which is not unexpected due to the large number of education students that graduate each year. Methods and Student Teaching have topped the list every year the question has been asked. In the past two years, Business Policy has been replaced by Social, Legal, and Political Environments of Business and Organizational Theory as more valuable courses in the Management major. Organization and Administration of Safety Programs has been popular every year. Psychology and Graphic Design courses such as Counseling and Electronic Imaging are appearing on the list more often than ever before, as their majors grow in size. Among the "most valuable general education courses", students typically find Essay Writing, which is required for all students, the most valuable. In addition, General Psychology, Introduction to Sociology, Computer Information Processing, and Fundamentals of Speech courses are frequently mentioned.

Comments

Two questions ask students what should be changed and what should not be changed. The responses to these questions give a history of the college. Complaints about poor faculty gave way to concerns about faculty being underpaid during the 'work to rule' contract dispute of the early 1990s. Negative comments about spending too much money on aesthetics in the mid nineties were replaced by rave reviews of the new Student Center in the following years. As the Dining Commons vendor changed, complaints about food quality changed to requests for more seating.

Summary

Some themes remain constant through the years. The faculty, Greek Life, and the look of the campus always receive numerous compliments. Parking and availability of classes are common concerns. The Office of Institutional Research continues to notice an improvement in the time and effort put into responding to the Graduating Student Surveys. This year, 85% of respondents took the time to respond to at least one of the questions "What changes would you like to have happen at KSC" and "What things do you feel should not be changed?"

What Should Not be Changed

The small class size and the size of the school received the most comments, with a combined 18% of the responses. It is clear that many of our faculty have made a deep and positive impression on our students. Sixteen percent of the students mentioned the faculty, often by name. Many of the general comments referred to the faculty's friendliness, accessibility, and helpfulness. Students clearly appreciated the new facilities that opened this year. Fourteen percent of students mentioned at least one facility, and another 4% mentioned the continuing improvements that are being done on campus. The new Recreation Center was most popular, with 8% of the comments mentioning how pleased they are with the facility. The latest renovations to the Library were also very well received, with comments such as "the new library is becoming better and better. It is a great place to work and study".

What Should be Changed

Concerns about Residential Life and specific academic majors were most often mentioned this year. Residential Life comments were equally divided between complaints about the overcrowding in the dorms and the new room draw process. Combining upper and lower classmen into the same dorm received many comments as well.

With academic majors, half the comments were regarding the ESEC department. Students continue to request opportunities to work in a classroom setting earlier in their college career, rather than waiting until Methods and Student Teaching.






















