PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATION

Provisional Certification requires application and acceptance to the program, and a motor vehicle and criminal records check prior to registering for the first course. State of NH Driver Education Instructor certification requirements include driver license possession for five consecutive years, a high school diploma or GED, and acceptable driving record.

SAFE 222 – SC1C: INTRODUCTION TO TRAFFIC SAFETY

Prerequisite: Acceptance to the Keene State Driver Education Teacher Certification Program. Elements that compose driving and the highway transportation system. Emphasis is on human performance, traffic engineering, and related research. For educators and those whose responsibilities include motor fleet safety.

Prerequisite: Successful completion of SAFE 222, Intro to Traffic Safety.

Focus on methods of classroom and laboratory teaching. State and national standards are recommended for teaching driver and traffic safety education. (Includes laboratory experience.)

Students can expect considerable out of class assignments.

Requires in-vehicle demonstrations by staff and students. Students can expect considerable out of class assignments.
