

The following summary provides a snapshot of progress to date *and* next steps in attaining Keene State College's Sustainability Goals. Our overarching goal, approved by the College in 2015, is to achieve the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) STARS Gold Rating by 2020.
