




**First-Generation Students** - Students report parental education on their admission application. First-generation students are those for whom neither parent possesses a four-year college degree.

**Pell Grant Recipients** – Pell-grant recipients are used as a proxy for low-income status. Some students who receive Federal Pell grants may not actually be from low-income families (for example, if there are many students from that family enrolled in college at once).











Percentage of Students from New Hampshire and Other States







## First-Time, First-Year Students







**Residency** is determined by the legal home state of the student. The legal home state of "Residents" is New Hampshire. The legal home state of "Non-residents" are states, territories, or countries other than New Hampshire.

**Class Levels** are based on the number of credits a student has completed - freshmen/first-year students have completed 0-29 credits, sophomores have 30-59, juniors have 60-89, and seniors have 90 or more credits.

**Race/Ethnicity** is gathered from all students at the point of entry according to federal guidelines. Students who are not US citizens or permanent residents are counted as non-resident aliens and are not included in race/ethnicity data.



**First-Generation Students** - Students report parental education on their admission application. First-generation students are those for whom neither parent possesses a four-year college degree.













#### **Retention and Graduation**

#### **Definitions**

**Post-Baccalaureates** are students with a bachelor's degree returning for teaching certification - counted as undergraduate level students.

**Post-Masters** are students with a master's degree returning for school leadership certification - counted as graduate level students.

**First-Generation Students** - Students report parental education on their admission application. First-generation students are those for whom neither parent possesses a four-year college degree.

**Race/Ethnicity** is gathered from all students at the point of entry according to federal guidelines. Students who are not US citizens or permanent residents are counted as non-resident aliens and are not included in race/ethnicity data.

**Pell Grant Recipients** – Pell-grant recipients are used as a proxy for low-income status. Some students who receive Federal Pell grants may not actually be from low-income families (for example, if there are many students from that family enrolled in college at once).

**Residency** is determined by the legal home state of the student. The legal home state of "Residents" is New Hampshire. The legal home state of "Non-residents" are states, territories, or countries other than New Hampshire.

**2nd Major** describes when a student pursues a dual major, they complete only one degree but must complete all courses required by two majors.







Number (& Percentage) of Graduated Students at All Levels by Gender










