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



















Number (& Percentage) of First-Time, First-Year Students by Race/Ethnicity































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Colleen Pascu produces the Factbook and the institution-level instructional analysis reports. She calculates the official retention and graduation rates. Colleen also maintains the IR&A Tableau dashboards.



Kim Schmidl-Gagne - Accreditation and Assessment Officer

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Kim Schmidl-Gagne serves the entire College by providing support for accredited academic programs and by acting as the institutional liaison with NECHE (New England Commission of Higher Education). Kim has primary responsibility for assessment initiatives with a priority focus on Academic programs.
