## Fall 2013 Enrollment Summary

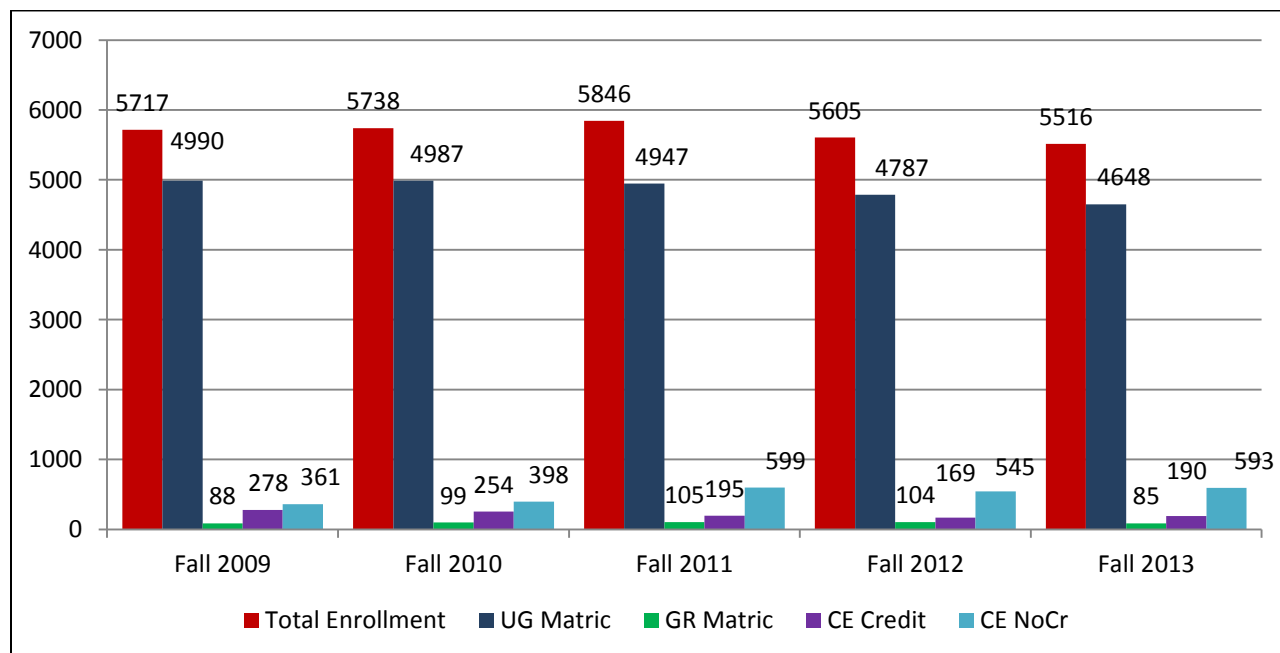
In fall 2013 Keene State College welcomed a student body of 5516 students in all categories of enrollment. This report provides some descriptive data about these students. A full description of the student body will be available when the *Factbook* is published later this year.

### ENROLLMENT TRENDS IN THE STUDENT BODY AS A WHOLE

#### *Total Headcount by Enrollment Status*

The graph below shows Keene State's headcount for the past five years with detail about the composition of the student body by enrollment status. As this graph shows, overall headcount grew from 2009 through 2011 and then declined in 2012 and again in 2013. The number of matriculated undergraduates has declined consistently throughout this five-year period. This lower headcount reflects, at least in part, a declining pool of high school graduates in New Hampshire.

### ***Residency – Matriculated Students***

Among matriculated students, the percentage from outside New Hampshire has grown from 47% in 2009 to 52% in 2013. The following table shows this progression.

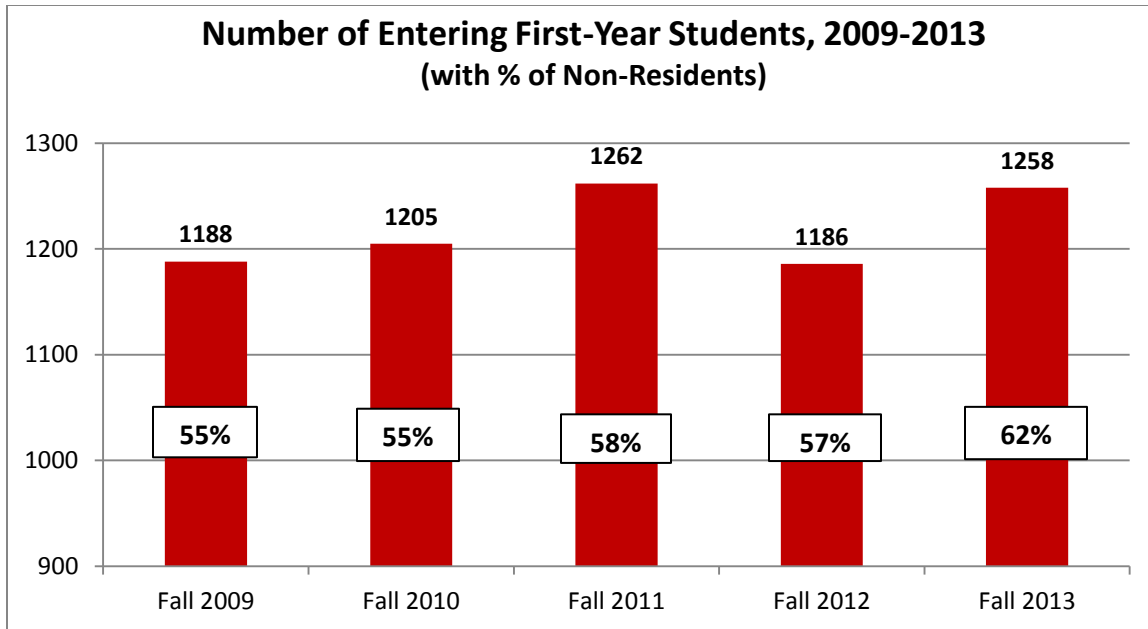

## ENROLLMENT TRENDS FOR ENTERING STUDENTS

### *Entering First-Year Students*

Keene State College enrolled 1258 new first-year students in fall 2013. This cohort is about the same size as the 2011 cohort ( $N = 1262$ ). The percentage of non-resident students in the entering first-year cohort is up by 5% from the previous year, to 62%. The following graph shows the size of the first-year cohorts for the past five years, along with the percentage of non-residents. The table below the graph displays demographic data for the fall 2013 entering first-year students.

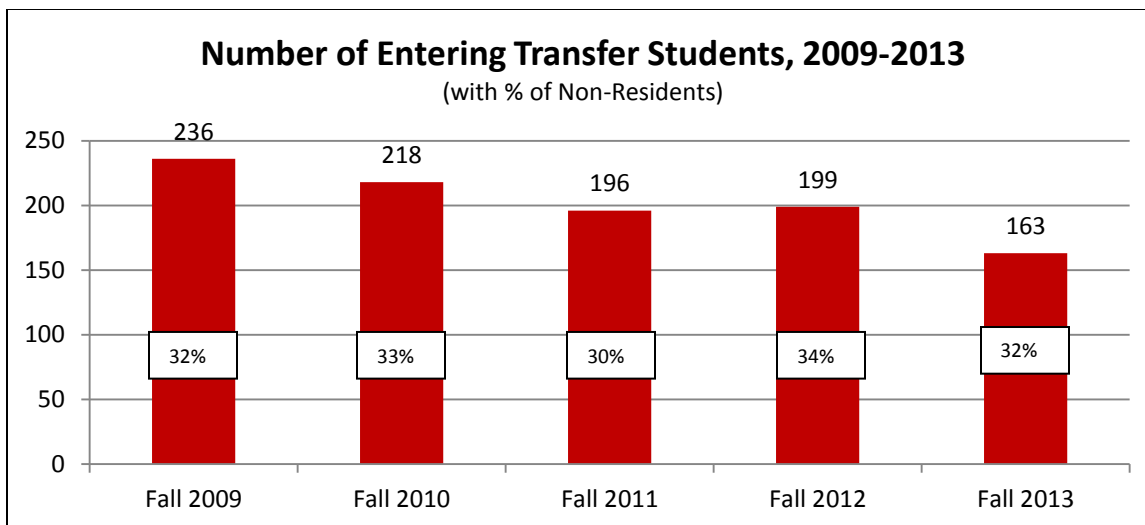
