<u>American Institute for Architects New York Chapter, Stewardson Keefe LeBrun Travel Grants</u> Grants of \$7,500 encourage travel within North America and overseas in furtherance of the architectural education and professional development of the recipients.	April
<u>American Library Association (ALA) - WESS Coutts Nijhoff International West European Specialist Study Grant</u> This grant supports research pertaining to Western European studies, librarianship, or the book trade. The primary criterion for awarding the grant is the significance and utility of the proposed project as a contribution to the study of the acquisition, organization, or use of library materials from or relating to Western Europe. Current or historical subjects may be treated.	December
<u>Amy Lowell Poetry Travelling Scholarship</u> This prize supports travel abroad for gifted American-born poets.	October
<u>American Physical Society, Leo Szilard Lectureship Award</u> The award consists of a \$1,000 stipend plus \$2,000 travel expenses for lectures given by the recipient at an APS meeting and at two or more educational institutions or research laboratories in the year following the award. The lectures should be especially aimed at physicists early in their careers.	July
<u>American School of Classical Studies at Athens (ASCSA)</u> Four fellowships are awarded annually to graduate students or postdoctoral scholars with question-driven research projects involving materials from archaeological contexts in Greece. Further details about each of the fellowships are available as PDF downloads on the website	January
<u>American Society for Microbiology, Travel Award</u> ASM provides funds to individuals to travel to and participate in meetings, conferences, and other professional development activities. Grants are available to students/postdocs as well as faculty.	March
<u>Archaeological Institute of America</u> The AIA offers six fellowships for travel and study to deserving scholars. Fellowships are open to AIA members.	Varies with Program

<p><u>Association of Performing Arts Presenters</u> – Cultural Exchange Fund</p> <p>This international travel subsidy program will assist professionals within the presenting field to build partnerships and collaborations. These new relationships will lead to expanded presenting and touring opportunities for deserving work, and support long term development projects, residencies or commissions. Applicants should address one or more of the following criteria:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Attendance at one or more performances or festivals to see live performances (at least three) by artists and/or companies, as well as meetings with established partners to discuss plans to present, partner with or commission new work or work in progress. 2. Projects that will create and nurture long-term exchange. 3. Connecting with artists as well as festival presenters and producers from around the world. 	<p>April, July & September</p>
<p><u>Association of Women in Mathematics</u> – Travel Grants</p> <p>The objective of the mentoring travel grants is to help junior women to develop a long-term working and mentoring relationship with a senior mathematician. This relationship should help the junior mathematician to establish her research program and eventually receive tenure. Each grant would fund travel, accommodations, and other required expenses for an untenured woman mathematician to travel to an institute or a department to do research with a specified individual for one month. The applicant's research must be in a field that is supported by the Division of Mathematical Sciences of the National Science Foundation (NSF). Awardees may request to use any unexpended funds for further travel to work with the same individual during the following year.</p>	<p>February</p>
<p><u>The Beverly Willis Architecture Foundation</u></p> <p>The foundation offers funding to individuals and institutions to support innovative projects that advance the study and expand the recognition of women in architecture and related professions. Travel Grants of up to \$1500 are for research trips or professional conferences at which the recipient will be making a presentation related to the purpose of the BAAF.</p>	<p>March</p>
<p><u>Chemical Heritage Foundation, Research Travel Grants</u></p> <p>CHF offers travel grants for research at its <u>Othmer Library of Chemical History</u>. These grants may be used for travel, food, lodging, and copying costs, up to \$500 for US residents and \$1,000 for individuals traveling internationally</p>	<p>Ongoing</p>
<p><u>The Frederick Soddy Trust</u></p> <p>The trustees of the Frederick Soddy Trust are willing to consider funding for any project which comes within the terms of its charitable objects: the study of the whole life of an area. In broad terms this means the inclusion of both human and physical geography in the plans of the applicants.</p>	<p>Continuous</p>
<p><u>Hayek Fund for Scholars</u></p> <p>The Hayek Fund for Scholars provides awards of up to \$1,000 to graduate students and faculty members for career-advancing activities. The award is open to graduate students who intend to pursue academic careers and untenured faculty members whose academic work contributes to the understanding of the principles, practices, and institutions necessary to a free society or to the understanding of the classical liberal or libertarian tradition. Hayek Fund awards are given for career-advancing activities including, but not limited to: Presentations at academic or professional conferences; Travel to academic job interviews (on campus or at professional/academic conferences); Travel to and research at archives or libraries. Please note: Hayek Fund awards are not given for conference attendance alone, funding will only be considered for individuals presenting a paper or interviewing for jobs at the conference.</p>	<p>Continuous</p>

<p>The Whiting Foundation awards small (approximately \$5,000) fellowships to present and prospective teachers, with an emphasis on present teachers at the college or university level, to enable them to study abroad of at some location other than that with which they are most closely associated. The aim is to stimulate and broaden the minds of teachers so as to improve and enhance the quality of their instruction. Most grants are primarily for travel and related expenses. Applications are welcomed from teachers at all New England colleges and universities. An annual RFP is sent to Keene State College each October, and is then distributed to all faculty.</p>	February
<p><u>Theatre Communications Group/International Theatre Institute, Travel Grants</u></p> <p>These \$3,000 grants will support travel in either direction between theatre professionals in the U.S. and their counterparts in Russia or Central/Eastern Europe.</p>	September
