Creator has a unique idea or work

## Creator DISCLOSES the INVENTION/CREATION to KSC

Only those works meeting 1 or more of the 4 criteria within the IP Policy must be disclosed. This includes works developed with (1) External/sponsored funding; (2) "Significant Use" of KSC resources as defined in the policy; (3) Specialized internal agreements between the creator and College; (4) Other legal agreements binding the College.

# Disclosure Review 1 (TreMonti) – Assessment of Potential

TreMonti Consulting provides background research to help KSC make informed decisions. This information is used by the KSC IPC in the next step.

- Is the invention/creation likely to garner interest and demand in society (e.g., business, industry, other non-profits)?
- What industries or entities might have a need for it?
- Under confidential disclosure arrangements, TreMonti may get preliminary feedback from outside entities.
